



We found our way to attending schooling jumper shows and CT's and were competitive. But Fizzy got nervous, so then I would get nervous and frankly both she and I didn't really feel the desire to jump anymore.

I found and joined NODA almost 6 years ago and it has been the best decision I have made for both of us. I am so loving the discipline of dressage and I know Fizzy does too. She still gets anxious as most of you know, but we are loving the journey and I'm trying my darndest not to push too hard, yet always tap into what I know she is capable of. I'm thinking when Fizzy is 20, I may have my dressage unicorn. But I'm hoping the mantra of "slow and sure" is the key with her. TDF Announces Inaugural Amanda Johnson Freestyle Fund Recipient

The Dressage Foundation (TDF) is pleased to announce Emily Gill of Louisville, OH, as the first grant recipient of the Amanda Johnson Freestyle Fund. This Fund provides an annual grant of up to \$2,000 to a young professional from USDF Region 2 or 4 to pay for the costs of creating a professionally prepared musical freestyle for competition.

Emily graduated from the University of Findlay in 2017, worked in Germany at the Hannoveraner Verband, and has been a professional instructor for the past three years. Emily served as the Assistant Coach of the University of Findlay's Intercollegiate Dressage Team and has been an assistant teacher for Dressage4Kids' Winter Intensive Training Program. She recently received her USDF gold medal on her Morgan, Kahlua. Emily will use the grant to work with Collier Wimmer to create a freestyle. She said, "This grant means the world to me! I have owned my horse since he was a yearling, and he is now 15 and at Grand Prix, so it will be special to have our first professional freestyle. I feel blessed to ride in honor of Amanda and am so grateful for this grant. This is an amazing new chapter in my dressage journey!"



This Fund was established by Amanda's family and friends in memory of her dedication to the sport of dressage. Amanda passed away in 2018 at the age of 37 after a three-year struggle with triple negative breast cancer. Her family and friends remember her as kind, generous, humble, talented, and brave. She was a well-respected member of the dressage community as a trainer, coach, competitor, and clinician. Amanda was a lifelong student of dressage and especially enjoyed showing in the musical freestyle classes.

REGION 2 CATHERINE B. JACOB SCHOOLING SHOW YEAR END AWARDS GUIDELINES, 2021

1. PURPOSE REGIONAL AND LOCAL LEVEL

- a. To help provide funds for Region 2 sponsored GMO Educational Fund
- b. To establish a standard set of dressage classes throughout the region that will count toward Region 2 Catherine B. Jacob Schooling Show Year End Program Awards.
- c. To encourage local competition managers to put together a series of schooling dressage competitions that will provide competitions with standard quality of classes and judges.
- d. To allow local competitor's scores to be recognized on a regional level without leaving their home area.
- e. To encourage competitors to improve their skills, gain show experience, and confidence to move up to USDF/USEF rated shows.
- f. To encourage a venue to educate and train a base of show volunteers: scribes, gatekeepers, scorers, bit checkers, etc. for local and USDF/USEF recognized shows.
- g. To encourage riders to join a local GMO (group Member Organization of USDF).

2. HORSE/RIDER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- a. Competitor must be a current or new member of a local GMO to compete for Region 2 Catherine B. Jacob Schooling Show Year End Awards Program.
- b. Competitor is responsible for following the rules and completing the requirements of the schooling shows.
- c. Musical Freestyles; competitors must send to Points Person a copy of a score of 60% or above of the highest test of the level they wish to compete in MFS.
- d. Competitor may compete in two adjacent levels on the same horse.
- e. Competitor may compete on more than one horse. Each horse/rider combination MUST complete the registration form and send to the Region 2 Points Person.
- f. Competitor MUST send a completed 2021 REGION 2 CATHERINE B. JACOB SCHOOLING SHOW REGISTRATION FORM for each horse/rider combination to the Region 2 Points Person with a check for \$25.00 for each level or \$45.00 for two adjacent levels, BEFORE their scores are eligible.
- g. Rider MUST send a completed REGION 2 CATHERINE B. JACOB SCHOOLING SHOW RESULTS FORM with readable copy of the front of each test to be used for year-end awards. FOUR test scores per level are needed. If fewer score are submitted, their average score will be placed below the four scores averaged. If more than FOUR scores are submitted, ALL scores sent will be averaged.
- h. Horse/rider combinations that have shown at USDF/USEF recognized competitions Second Level or above are NOT eligible to compete in Introductory or Training Level for this program.

3. CLASS ELIGIBILITY

- a. STANDARD SET OF DRESSAGE CLASSES
 - 1. USDF Intro A, B, & C

 - 3. FIRST LEVEL Tests 1-3
 - 4. SECOND LEVEL AND ABOVE (State Level)
 - 5. DRESSAGE HORSE IN HAND (3 YRS AND LESS)
 - 6. DRESSAGE HORSE IN HAND (4YRS AND OVER)
- 7. MUSICAL FREESTYLES (State Level)
- 8. WESTERN DRESSAGE (TOC)
- 9. GAITED DRESSAGE (TOC))

4. YEAR END AWARDS

- a. Awards will be given up to the top 10 places in each LEVEL, if entrants warrant. Divisions (JR, OPEN, Adult /AM, VINTAGE) may be combined if entrants warrant (Junior-18 or under) (Vintage 50 and over- Specify OPEN or A/A)
- b. FOUR scores per LEVEL are needed to qualify for Year End Awards. If THREE or less scores are submitted, they will be averaged and placed below the FOUR averaged scores. If MORE than FOUR scores are submitted all scores will be averaged. Final placing is based on their AVERAGED PERCENTAGE SCORES as set out above.
- c. Award results will be published on the Region 2 Website and may be reproduced in local GMO newsletters and websites.
- d. Awards will be mailed to the recipient. **Scores submitted must be postmarked by NOVEMBER 5.** Show year will be from November 1 to October 31 of the following year.



"Keeping the Happy Horse"

Riding in the Cold

Everything seems to be a bit more difficult in the cold weather. From the mud and lack of sun to the often treacherous driving conditions, just getting out to the bam can be quite a task. This year we are lucky enough to have a winter that is slow to start, but do not fear, the cold weather and snow are just around the corner. This is a great time to start thinking about the different

This is a great time to start thinking about the different ways that you can keep your horse as comfortable as possible during the next few months. If you are planning on keeping your horse fit and working throughout the winter months, it is probably a good idea to consider body clipping and blanketing. This is a great way to speed up the cooling down and drying period after your work out. Making sure that your horse is dry before returning him to his stall for the evening is extremely important. Even a little bit of dampness can cause your horse to become sick or even colic in extreme temperatures. It is good idea to have a routine for cooling your horse down after a work session. When the temperature dips below 30 degrees, I like to cover my horses back with a medium weight wool or polar fleece quarter sheet for the last 15 minutes of the ride. Covering their backs as you start the cooling down phase of your ride will help to slowly bring the core temperature back to normal as your horses pulse is slowly reduced. Once in the cross ties, I remove the quarter sheet and place a full size cooler over his back. As I remove the saddle, I pull the cooler over the withers and neck to fully cover my horses topline. After the saddle is put away and I put my jacket back on, I start towel drying my horses head and legs with a large dry towel.

*Now is a good time to do your "post-ride" stretches before your horse's muscles lose their suppleness. Once his head and legs are rubbed down, I check and make sure that his feet are clean dry. If you ride in wet footing every day during the winter, it is extremely important to fully dry your horses feet off after each ride. If you do not have time to dry them off by hand, put your horse in a clean stall for 10 or 15 minutes and then use a stiff brush to remove the dry sand and mud from the outside and bottom of the hooves. Have your farrier keep an eye on the moisture level of your horses feet, especially in the winter months and be sure to treat any signs of thrush very carefully. I keep my horses hooves treated with a mixture of DMSO and Bigeloil about once a week. This mixture is great because the DMSO fights the bacteria growth and the Bigeloil can help bring blood flow to the frog and heal region. After your horse is fully dry, give any matted areas on his coat a quick curry and put his sheet/blanket back on for the day.

Another area to watch in the winter is your horses feed and water in-take. Lack of clean, fresh water in the winter is a common cause of impaction colic. Many studies have shown that when a horse has access to warmer water in extremely cold temperatures, their water in-take greatly increases. That sounds obvious, but even emptying and refilling a bucket can bring the water temperature high enough to promote drinking. Feed also needs to be slightly adjusted during cold weather.

The average 1,000 lb mature horse needs to consume between 15 and 18 lbs of ha to keep his energy in=take high

enough. Most horses need to have their calories increased by 15-20% for every 10 degrees the temperature drops below 30 degrees. A great way to increase your horses energy and calorie in-take is by adding 6-8 ounces of vegetable oil every day or by adding a commercial fat supplement to your horses feed. Always keep in mind that some horses are much easier keeps than others. What some horses may need to remain comfortable may send another horse though the roof. There can be a fine line between just enough and too much for each horse, but taking the time to find out what your horse needs can be very important. Watch the weeks weather forecast and plan ahead. If a cold front is heading our way, you ay want to consider adding a few flakes or a pound or two of grain to your horses feed schedule for those days.

Turning out can be difficult during the winter months. If it is possible to have your horses shoes pulled for the winter, most farriers will recommend it. This cuts down on risk of your horse forming "snowballs" under their feet and gives their feet a chance to "rest." Because my horses re kept in full time training through the winter, I opt to keep the shoes on. The horses that I turn out out-doors during the winter are put in leather snow pads from late November until early April. One of my favorite purchases was a waterproof dress sheet. This keeps my horses blankets dry and clean during turn out and is easy to take on and off over top of their oral stable blankets. If your do find your horses blanket to be wet, remove it as soon as possible and dry your horse as you would after a ride

The last thing to remember during the cold weather is to care for your tack. Be sure to take your saddle, bridle and boots into a warm area to thaw and be cleaned as often as possible. Cold weather can cause wet leather to shrink and crack very quickly. If the tack area in your barn is cold or damp, take your tack home with you for cleaning. Making sure that the leather is thawed out before cleaning will help the cleaner to soak into the leather fully. Cleaning cold tack can cause the cleaner/soap to stay on top of the leather and become sticky. This is a common cause of "squeaky" riding boots in cold weather.

Well I hope this helps you and your horses stay warm and dry during the upcoming winter season. Have fun riding and think Spring!!

LEG-YIELDING

Leg-yielding is a useful exercise to loosen and supple your 3. At the same time, feel the left rein, or half-halt on the horse, while teaching your horse to move away from your leg. This exercise can be introduced at an early stage of training and can be used through the horse's education.

The definition of leg-yielding from the ASHA rule book is as follows: "The horse is almost straight, except for a slight positioning at the poll away from the direction in which he moves, so that the rider is just able to see the eyebrow and nostril on the inside. The inside legs pass and cross in front of the outside legs. Leg-yielding can be performed on the diagonal in which case the horse should be as close as possible parallel to the long sides of the arena although the fore hand should be slightly in advance of the quarters, it can also be performed along the wall in which case the horse should be at an angle of about 35 degrees to the direction in which he is moving.

The description of the leg-yielding states what one needs to see as the horse is performing this movement, and what the judge expects to see.

There are several prerequisites before asking the horse to leg-yield. The horse needs to be forward, straight, rhythmic and a half-halt is very helpful.

The aids for the leg-yield from the right leg are as follows:

- 1. Position the horse slightly to the right.
- 2. Slide the right leg behind the girth and every time the right hind lifts off the ground squeeze your right leg against the horse.


left rein. In other words, you push with your right leg and receive and control that energy with your left rein. This creates an inside leg to the outside rein connection. This concept is very important!

The left shoulder can lead slightly, but you do not want the horse to lean on the shoulder with the left rein. Also, support with your left leg to help balance the horse from side to side and not allow the horse to move sideways any faster than you want. (The rhythm should stay the same and not quicken.) The left leg also encourages the horse to move forward as it moves sideways.

Another common fault is the occurrence of the haunches leading. Making sure the horse's shoulders are in front of the haunches, reduces the chances of this occurring.

Often, a horse will turn down the center line in preparation for leg-yielding from the center line to the wall, the rider over turns the horse with the inside rein, allowing the haunches to swing to the outside. In this situation, when the rider applies the leg to ask the horse to move over, the haunches will lead, which is more difficult for the horse, incorrectly executed and can lead to resistance and confusion in the horse and rider.

(A note from the groom: Leg-yielding is similar to standing in a buffet line. The longer you stay in one place the less you get to eat.)
