## Emily Gill and Coulee Bend Kahlua are USA Working Equitation Region 5 Masters Level, Open Champions!

NODA sends congratulations to Emily Gill, 2021 USA Working Equitation, Region 5 Masters Level, Open Champion! Emily Gill, NODA's professional Liaison and owner of Emily's Equestrian Enterprises is a USDF Bronze, Silver, and Gold medalist, all accomplished on her self-trained "16 year old, 15.2 hand-ish, Chestnut (but more like a copper penny), Morgan gelding, Coulee Bend Kahlua (Kahlua)." To accomplish this, Emily and Kahlua qualified by competing the Masters Dressage Test and the Ease of Handling obstacle course, then headed out to the Region 5 Championships which took place October 22 - 25, 2021 at Hoosier Horse Park, Nineveh, IN.

According to USA Working Equitation
(USAWE) the "Masters Dressage Test requires pairs to perform walk, trot, canter, halt, and rein back. In addition, horses and riders must perform extended gaits, pirouettes, lateral movements, and flying lead changes in canter. Movements are performed in a prescribed order, but not in prescribed locations within the arena. The horse and rider have 8 minutes to complete.

the arena. The horse and rider have 8 minutes to complete the dressage test, and must perform their dressage test to music of their choosing in the small sized dressage arena. The rider must ride with one hand on the reins, and trot work should be performed sitting."

The Ease of Handling course at the master's level includes a minimum of 12 obstacles in order and "canter is required in and between obstacles, and flying changes of lead are required. Obstacles must be cantered, unless required or allowed to be walked, and one hand must be used on the reins exclusively." Obstacles can include a bridge, a single or double slalom, opening and closing a gate, a jump, the rein back L with a bell, and obstacles that include removing and replacing a pole in a barrel. Because Emily promotes WE for her dressage clients, I wanted to hear from her why she thinks WE is so useful for all riders.

I asked Emily how Working Equitation helps with dressage as a cross training tool? Emily told me, "being involved in WE for about 3 years, I have seen how it has helped so

many horses. I have watched as horses overcome some of their fears, I have seen them get clean changes using the obstacles, and I have seen rider's enhance their horse's gaits and transitions in preparing for the obstacles. It is amazing how you set out two barrels and the horse is now understanding your bending aids. It's a great cross training tool for all horses and riders at any level. I think for the rider it gives us that visual of how we want the horse to move or the preparation we need to provide for the horse in order to not run over a pole. Working Equitation is super helpful and fun for the horse and rider!"

Kahlua and Emily had their first lesson in Florida in February of 2019. When they came back to Ohio that summer there was a clinic at Brecksville Stables hosted by CADS and after that the rest is history. Emily shares, "I was hooked! We had our first competition year in 2020. We

competed in Intermediate B and we won the buckle series for highest score in that level for the season! In 2021 we started at Advanced level and I got some inspiration from some teammates to do Masters and it was an amazing challenge that I am so glad we did." I had the opportunity to watch Emily's Masters level, Ease of Handling qualification test earlier this year. Watching Emily guide Kahlua off her seat and one handed while navigating the obstacles at the canter with transitions to the walk as needed was an eye opener. She skillfully completed all challenges and dressage movements required in a relaxed and harmonious manner. It was easy to see that it takes a well trained, on the aides mount to accomplish.

Emily told me she first tried Working Equitation mainly, "because I am always ready to try new things. When I heard there was a clinician coming to provide a clinic on working equitation in Florida, I was like, sign me up! We even did our lesson in the pouring down rain and it was still a blast! Anytime I get to do something different on my horse I am so excited for the challenge! And Kahlua is such a willing horse that he too is up for the challenge!"

I gave working equitation a try earlier this summer at Emily's encouragement (she had been mentioning it to me for about a year). I took one lesson and then attended a fun day with obstacles set up that we could try on our own and ask for help if we needed it. For me and Alaska it was a confidence builder. He was so willing and ready to try all the obstacles, but even more important I got a great sense of how to use my outside aids to define a circle or a bend. Alaska was more than willing to canter a 12 meter circle without knocking over the cones! I went home and began incorporating obstacles that help with bend, rein back, and lateral aides into my rides. Alaska seems happy to have a change of pace and I have learned so much!

I asked Emily how a rider interested in giving Working Equitation a try can find a schooling show or clinic events to attend? Emily said one way to find out more about Working Equitation is to go to USAWE web site at <a href="https://usawe.org/">https://usawe.org/</a> and read about the tests and obstacles as well as clinics and competitions. USA Working Equitation (USAWE) is a 501(c)(3) organization formed in 2020, when WE United and the Confederation for Working Equitation consolidated into a single national organization.

Emily noted that "CADS, a USDF GMO, has been the lead group in NE Ohio providing clinics, recognized, and schooling Working Equitation shows at Brecksville Stables. They were the first in Ohio to have a WE show! It's worth it to check out their events and attend or audit one since it is so close to home for us in NE Ohio." Find out more at www.cadsdressage.org

NODA is dabbling in Working Equitation too! Emily will teach a clinic to campers as a part of the NODA Dressage Camp and More for Adults, which will take place in June at Stone Gate Farm. More on that in the January Issue of the NODA News. Emily also has other Working Equitation clinics scheduled in 2022 and she plans to be offering even more WE education in the future. Emily says she "enjoys the sport and the people she's met and would love to spread the word about this sport to more riders!"

### **Lendon Gray Adult Clinic Recap**

Lake Erie College and NODA co-sponsored the Lendon Gray Adult Clinic on Friday, October 29 at the Lake Erie College, George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center in Painesville, Ohio. Riders were scheduled every 45 minutes and Gray generally began the session by watching the riders put their horse's through the gaits. Gray was sensitive to how the horses reacted to the atmosphere and the ex-

ercises. She structured exercises so that the more sensitive horses were not over faced. But when refusal to work or lack of forward presented, Gray had tips and tricks up her sleeve based on the individual needs of the horse

and rider. Every horse and rider pair had strengths noted by Gray, but she also pointed out where the weaknesses were and how to deal with or overcome them. She minced no words and every rider got their full 45 minutes worth of work, if not a little bit more. The riders were all able to apply and adapt to the instruction and I could hear murmurs among the auditors when something the riders were working on resonated with them.

Auditing was free for all and there were a good number sitting in the bleachers watching and listening. Quite a few were taking notes on tips and exercises Gray offered the riders. One tidbit Gray shared that really resonated with me was,

"A half halt is only a half halt if the aides Subside - otherwise you're just hanging."

And in case we didn't get it she rephrased it,

"When using an aid - use it, then shut up. Don't keep doing something."

If that's all I got out of the clinic, it was well worth the time spent. Of course, there was so much more to be gleaned from the day with Lendon Gray.

Forty-five minute clinic rides were offered for members and non-members alike, with non-members paying an additional fee. Stabling was available and lunch was provided as a part of the clinic fee. Auditors registered in advance could purchase lunch. The clinic was coordinated

by the Education Chair Elizabeth Scalabrino with Jennifer Cooper, the NODA Junior/Young Rider Liaison who managed the Dressage4Kids Clinic on October 30 and 31. NODA sends appreciation to Lake Erie College, Beth Scalabrino and Jen Cooper for all their had work in organizing the Lendon Gray Adult Clinic.

### A little about Lendon Gray from the D4K website:

Born in Old Town, Maine, Lendon Gray rode her first horse with her mother before she could walk. She grew up riding western, hunt seat, bareback, playing gymkhana games, driving and generally enjoying horses. Pony Club played the central role in her life from age 7, and she competed successfully to the National level, winning Champion and Reserve at both US and Canadian Pony Club Rallies. Through her involvement with Pony Club she became a successful event rider and trained for two years with the Olympic 3-day team.

It was when Lendon started to specialize in Dressage at age 27 that Seldom Seen, the first of her famous Dressage "ponies," came into her life. At just 14.2 ½ hands Seldom Seen was a national champion at 3rd and 4th level, Prix St. George's, Intermediare I and II, and Grand Prix. Although Lendon rode warmbloods for her participation on two

Olympic teams (1980, 1988), the World Championships, and the World Cup, her ponies held a special place in her heart.

Lendon developed a reputation for "taking unremarkable horses and making them good." This belief in created talent and the power of dedication has inspired many of Lendon's activities over

the years. Determined to give others the opportunity to learn and improve, she has been extremely involved with organizations such as USET, USEF, USDF, US Pony Club, and the rapidly expanding Dressage4Kids (D4K).

NODA was happy that Gray could extend her weekend to offer adults the opportunity to lesson with her here in NE Ohio. NODA is a 501 c 3 non-profit education organization, so clinics and educational events are an integral part of NODA's mission.








