Member Spotlight - Welcome RIANA Regine!

We recently welcomed another four-legged member to our already gigantic family. Her name is Riana Regine, a 13-year-old Swedish Warmblood mare imported from Sweden. She is gentle, very friendly and a bit sensitive. Riana is a dark bay, 16.2h with a forehead star and small splash of white on her nose tip. She is by Richfield/Riccione out of Westina (F.2)/Midt-West Ibi-Light. Ever since we retired Arabella from riding (she is currently 25), we were searching for a kind-hearted and talented mare to ride in addition to Don Diesel Ray (also a Swedish Warmblood). I love working with Chrissa Hoffmann (owner of CFH Dressage) from Vero Beach FL whose partner (Andreas) in Sweden seeks out appropriate mounts depending upon your needs and goals.



I have high hopes to refine my riding skills and perhaps get back in the FEI show ring at some point in the future. Riana is very light in the bridle and goes in the snaffle very well. Riana is lithe with smooth and graceful gaits. All girl.

Imported horses need time to settle into their new world which is all so different. A different language, feed, environment, turnout protocols, climate and riding style. All are new. It is not uncommon for imports to lose a bit of weight on the trip which include ground, sometimes water, and air transportation. The USA Mare quarantine is quite lengthy and takes a toll on the horse's confidence and transitioning. Their ability to adjust is rather remarkable in my opinion. So, I am patient and getting to know her to develop that bond

that you can forever forge with mares.

They found Riana during COVID restrictions, so I was unable to travel to visit Sweden to ride her. Andreas was able to bring a test rider in my stead and provide honest and trusted feedback on the experience. It is never as good as a personal "sit" but it is the next best option with COVID and other responsibilities here in the United States. All my horses have middle names, (yes, they are our children), and we gave Riana the middle name of "Regine" which is the German/French version of my name, Regina. Guess I finally got my namesake!

Riana joins Don Diesel Ray and Arabella Marie at Topline Stables at Walden in Aurora, Ohio. I doubt the "girls" will become best friends, but Riana has a healthy respect for the sitting Princess of the barn – Arabella.

P.S., For those asking, Fabian Michael is still being ridden and leased in Virginia Beach. He is coming 28.

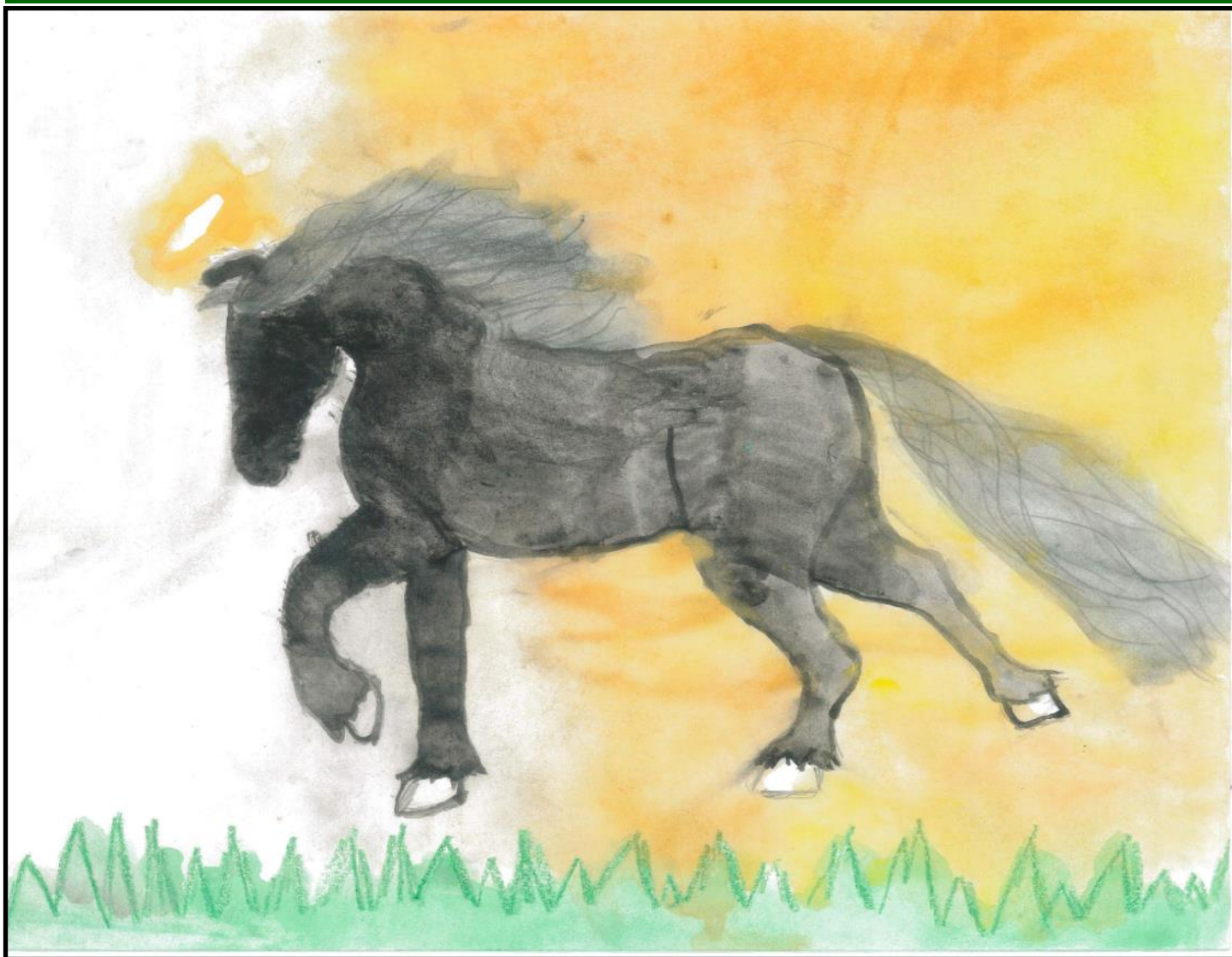

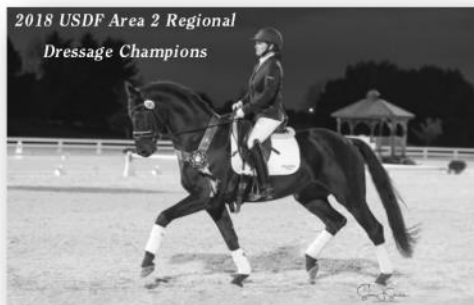

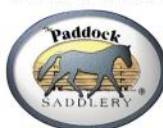

I'm only recently self-taught from books, videos and just playing around. The piece I submitted is graphite and colored pencil. I am sticking to pencil work for now and plan to try watercolor in the future."

Gail reminds us that "both working on an art piece and practicing dressage skills require attention to detail. They fully absorb you in the moment and can both frustrate and recharge you. Both are fantastic when you get in the zone with them."

Gail rides Winter who is a 16.3 hand Satche and says he is "a 24 year old very strict schoolmaster. He is a big chestnut who is a dream to ride if you are correct and a big lug if you are not. My continuing goal is to be correct more of the time!"

In the winter, Winterstern 6 lives at home with Gail's Friesian Sport Horse mare, Syzygy, and her retired 30 year old Saddlebred, Bayou. She loves seeing them all day and watching their antics. "I take lessons with Kris Ropp. Because of her dance background she is very focused on rider position. As a retired physician our discussions often involve lots of anatomy which is very helpful to how I understand my position's influence on the horse (and, of course, Winter gives immediate feedback!)."

About the Dressage4Kids™ TEAM Program—Training, Education And Mentoring

The D4K TEAM Program is for Dressage competitors age 25 and under. It is meant as a stepping-stone from participating at the grassroots level to climbing the long ladder on the way to representing a country in international competitions, to becoming successful professionals, and/or to becoming the very best dressage riders they can be. Through this program, dedicated, talented Dressage youth will be sought out. The teacher(s) in the clinics will ensure that the basics of their education as riders and horsemen are properly established and will give them a road map for their Dressage journey.

Interested riders 25 and under can apply by filling out an application and placing online a short video of themselves riding. There is no deadline for applications. Any interested riders should apply immediately. In the video, selectors are looking for the correctness of the rider's seat, connection to the horse, timing of aids, use of half halts, as well as a feel for rhythm, tempo, relaxation, and thoroughness of the horse – all commensurate to the level of the rider. **It is not necessary that the rider be riding at a high level. Riders as young as 8 have participated in the clinics as well as riders working at training level.**

During the clinic sessions, the instructors will evaluate and try to improve the rider's position, use of aids, knowledge, and abilities for competitive Dressage. The riders may also receive written evaluations. Riders do not need to have their own horses, if they can find a horse to borrow. At all training sessions, instruction is also provided in stable management, riding theory, fitness, sports psychology, etc.

NODA's Holistic Horse Series; Pulsed Electro - Magnetic Field, MagnaWave

NODA's second Holistic Horse Series' event on the topic of MagnaWave, Pulsed Electro-Magnetic Field (PEMF) was held virtually on April 17th. Practitioner Nikki Rider, owner of Elite Performance Therapy and certified MagnaWave practitioner was our guest speaker. Nikki went through a great PowerPoint presentation and then worked on one of her family's draft horses. First Nikki went over the PEMF machine and the different attachments and how they are used. She also shared how a person can become certified to be a practitioner as well as how you go about leasing or buying a machine.

I was surprised to learn that PEMF has been around since the 1940s! I thought it was a much more recent option for humans, horses, and other animals. MagnaWave helps to decrease inflammation, and increase energy, recovery time, sleep, range of motion, detoxification and absorption of supplements/medications. It can be used for injuries, sore muscles, training, and for laminitis, navicular, and abscesses. It should not be performed when an injury is actively bleeding. It can even help mobility in stallion production. MagnaWave leaves the patient with no after treatment down time needed, but patients should consume water afterwards as it can create more frequent bowel movements and hydration is important!

Nikki showed us how a treatment would go with her horse, who already knew about the equipment. Normally, if dealing with a new horse, she would get them acclimated to the equipment and the feel of it on them by letting them sniff it and then rubbing it on them. The clicking sound of the machine can also be a little scary for some horses. She always starts on a lower setting and works up to what is average for each weight class of horses. She goes a little higher if needed. The higher the frequency, the deeper into the muscles it will go. The lower, the more superficial it is. Extremities also require a higher setting so the

animal can feel it. Usually, the horse will tell her where to set the machine and how long to leave it there because of the twitching that occurs in the muscles. During the treatment you may see your horses' muscles twitching, but this is not unusual and nothing to worry about. Nikki always turns the frequency back down before moving to another body part, then starts low again in the new area. Sometimes horses will show signs of relaxation during the treatment as they did in our first Holistic Horse Series event, massage, by yawning and stretching. Most horses really enjoy treatments.

Questions from our audience included frequency of visits. Nikki said that if there are no injuries, a treatment once a month is just fine. Suspension issues could be as frequent as two times a week. With injuries, it is better to start with more frequent visits and then taper off treatments.

Another question was how long a treatment takes and how much it costs. Full body sessions for the horse take about 40 minute and is priced at \$80. A 20 - 30 minute targeted session focusing on areas of concern are also available. Nikki also provides services to humans. Nikki will travel to most of our area, especially if working on more than one animal or human while there.

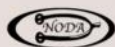
