NODA News You Can Use - Awards Program

Eligibility: Awards are open to all NODA members and will be presented at the annual banquet

Score Eligibility: Competitors must be members PRIOR to scores being earned

Horse Owners: The owner of a horse ridden by a Professional must also be a NODA member at the time the score is earned

A Horse and Rider combination may apply for a total of three (3) Trophies in the following divisions: Recognized/Unrecognized (Schooling) Trophies, Unrecognized (Schooling) Shows Trophies, Recognized Shows Trophies

Awards Deadline: Submission of scores for 2021 Awards must be postmarked by the deadline.

Competition Report Form & Applying for Awards: Scores must be sent on the official Competition Report Form and must include copies of applicable test fronts or USDF score sheets from www.USDFscores.com. Separate competition report forms and proof of scores must be submitted for each level of competition for the Scholarship Awards, and for every eligible Trophy.

NODA Bucks Required to Apply: Four (4) NODA bucks earned during the current competition year must be attached and submitted with your official Award Competition Report Form(s) for each horse nominated for awards. Applicable to Professionals, Adult Amateurs, and Junior/Young Riders! Only four (4) NODA bucks required for each horse/rider team, whether you apply for one award or several.

Volunteer Hours & NODA Bucks: Volunteers earn NODA bucks for their volunteer time, they must be signed and dated by issuing board or committee member when they are earned. Riders must donate four (4) hours of their time during the current competition year.

Scores from Panel of Judges: If submitting a score from a panel of judges the combined average must be submitted. It is still permissible to use different score, earned at that same show or another, from a judge who had been on the panel of judges for the Championship ride.

Scores obtained from Opportunity Classes (offered at Recognized Competitions) may only be submitted for Unrecognized (Schooling Show) Year-End Awards. They will be treated the same as scores earned at non-NODA Schooling Shows. Important Note: Scores from the NODA's July Recognized Shows may not be used as substitutions for the two (2) that must be earned at NODA schooling Shows.

Scores from non-NODA schooling shows may be submitted if the show is open to all NODA members and has been advertised in the NODA newsletter and/or website. The judge holds a current USEF dressage judge license, OR has held a card in the past, OR is a USDF "L" program graduate.

Novice riders who compete at non-NODA shows which do not offer specific novice classes may submit Intro or Training Level scores from these shows towards NODA Novice awards. The same test score may be used for either Novice classes or open classes but cannot be used for both.

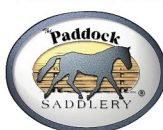

Northern Ohio Dressage Association Elected Offices – Job Descriptions

All elected officers are expected to attend, and are entitled to vote at monthly Board meetings

President

Acts as the primary representative of NODA.
Prepares the agenda for and presides over all Association and Board meetings.
Appoints Committee positions with the approval of the Executive Committee.
Acts as the point of contact for the USEF and the USDF on behalf of NODA.
Updates rosters for Region 2 as needed.
Attends or appoints someone to attend USDF and USEF annual meetings.
Can approve expenditures up to \$200.
If an elected official's position becomes vacant, the President appoints someone to fill the vacancy.

Vice President

Exercises any power or duty of the President in the absence of the President.
Is included in all decisions and organizing responsibilities.
Serves on the NODA Recognized Show Committee.

Recording Secretary

Maintains the official record of attendance at Board meetings.
Records and distributes minutes of meetings of the Association and Board of Directors.
Submits draft of minutes to Board for approval.

Treasurer

Is the registered agent for Non-Profit Organization status.
Keeps complete records of all Association expenditures, and reviews accounts monthly.
Collects all monies due to the Association.
Maintains all Association financial records and oversees fundraising activities.
Records, maintains, and files all necessary corporate certificates.
Works with the CPA to ensure that tax returns are completed and filed.
Keeps all financial affairs up to date and provides financial reports and budgets to the Association members upon request.
Maintains a checking account at a local bank with multiple branches.
Pays all the Association expenses to vendors, judges, clinicians, etc.
Issues reimbursement for approved expenditures.

Attends monthly Board meetings.
Represents the views of the membership.
Acts in the best interest of the association in Board discussions and decisions.

Bitsy Gascoigne - My Journey With Awkward Silence

My relationship with horses started at the age of 2 when I could sit on a pony. My mom couldn't push a stroller down the dirt road our farm, Fox Run Farm was on, so a pony was the next best thing. That pony was a Shetland pony named "Lambie Pie." When I was old enough I started showing 4-H, became a Pony Club member and ended up showing the pony hunter divisions, Children's Hunters, Junior Hunters and Amateur Hunter divisions as well as some Jumper Divisions, earning many championships along the way, most recently I received my USDF Bronze Medal.

I joined NODA in the early 90's when I actually started riding Dressage due to a back injury rethinking the need to jump large fences, I enjoyed the challenge of it and have been hooked ever since. Everyone in NODA is always very helpful and supportive and they provide good educational opportunities for all levels and everyone knows everyone.

I actually found "Daisy Mae," AKA Awkward Silence, who is now a 7yr y/o, 16 hh, OTTB, mare, in a picture my friend Kelly Williams posted on Face Book! Yes, I bought her from her picture after I messaged Kelly to get her story in case I knew anyone that might be looking. I NEVER expecting to actually own her, but for some reason that face stayed with me; her kind eye. My current horse situation was changing, so I figured "why not? I need to have something to ride, if she doesn't work out, I can always sell her." I never actually saw her till I went to go get her. I had my friend Danielle Struna, who is a Veterinary Technician at the track go look at her first because I figured she knows what to look for as far as any concerning injury, but nothing was wrong with her that couldn't be fixed with some time off. Her last race was about 1 month before I brought her home. Since the first time I sat on her I felt the connection and haven't looked back.

She has become my partner in crime, she has such a level head and always tries to please but can add the "red headed Thoroughbred mare" spice in at times, which is why I have always loved mares, they always give 100%.

Last summer due to COVID, we did a lot of Schooling Dressage shows, Combined tests, Mini Trials and trail riding. I feel is so important for show horse to get out of the ring, clear their heads, have fun and use their bodies differently and build different muscles, I believe a good horse is a happy horse.

Last year we earned Champion Training Level AA and Reserve Champion Intro Level AA for the USDF Catherine B Jacobs Schooling Show Awards for Region 2, NEOMTA Champion for Starter Rider along with several High Score and T.I.P Awards (highest scoring Thoroughbred) at NODA and Chagrin Valley Farms Dressage Schooling Shows.

Since I started with Daisy Mae, I have been working with B.J. Hartman who teaches the biomechanics of riding, not only for Daisy Mae, but also for myself. She has helped me learn to become a better rider, how to help my horse and not hinder or get in her way. Learning that your horse's straightness, how you use your body, leg position, hand position.... it all matters in how they go. I have learned that biomechanics can help you and your horse become a better team, along with correcting my bad habits I thank B.J. a million times over!

I'm not sure I can put into words how my successful outing at NODA Dressage 2021 and NODA 2021 Encore makes me feel....elated would be the word, especially since Daisy Mae was diagnosed at the beginning of the year with Kissing Spine in the withers, then she injured herself and needed to be on stall rest for a bit and then we had to wait for the new saddle to arrive. I wasn't even sure there was going to be a show season for us this year,

but thanks to our village, everything worked out. It's still surreal for me. Winning "The Best Hands" award was the best moment of the whole weekend, we all strive to have good hands, it's so hard to achieve them. In my equitation class the judge said, "I love your hands and how soft they are with your horse." That's when you know all your hard work has paid off. I'm not sure another Adult Amateur has even won that award, so I feel very honored to have been chosen for it. Also doing that well means to me that the underdog really can have a chance, you don't need a \$10,000 or more horse to achieve great things. If you work hard enough, have patience with yourself and your horse and remember not to push them up the levels before they are ready you can be successful.

The rest of this year we're going to be working with B.J. Hartman and Lauren Ball-Tisdale to get ready for USDF Region 2 Championships. More than likely we're going to be doing some shows prior to keep us sharp, but most of

all I'm going to enjoy my horse.

When I'm not with my horses or at a show I like to do most anything. I really enjoy parks, going to local wineries, and being with my 2 dogs and watching any of the "Housewives" shows.

So they wanted to know if I had any "Pearls of Wisdom" for other Adult Amateurs, all I can say is this...remember to enjoy your horse and your sport, and have fun. We are SO lucky to get to work with such AMAZING animals, no matter what your discipline. They ALLOW us to ride them, they all have their quirks and personalities, we as riders need to embrace that and keep learning to ride better to help them. It's not always about a ribbon or championship, although those are nice, it's about the journey and who you and your horse become.

So with that, cheers my friends, wishing you all good rides down the centerline!!!

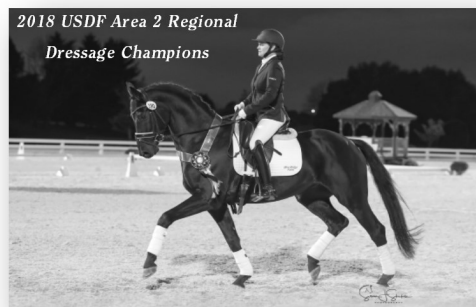
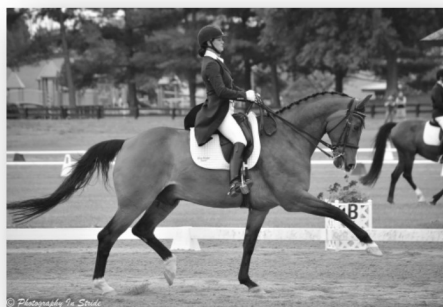

Member Spotlight - Beth Bayron

Interview by Mosie Welch

Tell us a little bit about how you got into horses?

My aunt took us trail riding while we were on vacation in WV. I was 8. I was pretty shy before that but after that I had something to talk about. I eventually told an adult who had a horse and didn't mind bringing me around. I rode her horse for 15 years, including a few years as a competing member of Western Pennsylvania Youth Rodeo Association.

Tell us a little about Pippin and how you two got together?

Pippin, aka, Peep, is a 16 y/o (or so), 14.3 hh, grade gelding. Pippin was at a facility where I volunteered in the winter of 2013. He had been purchased at the auction in Sugar Creek, Ohio. The first time I touched him he nearly kicked the person next to me in the head. We had to keep working with him to make him safe to have on the property. He changed drastically just in 2 weeks. The facility owner gave me the ultimatum that either I buy him or she takes him back to the auction, so I did it! We started with a dressage trainer in 2014 because she was willing to work with us after our first ever trainer told me to sell Pippin because he was "crazy" and wouldn't work out for me. I have worked with Julie Kotlarz-Franzen for the last 3 years. I think one of the biggest things for which I give her credit is helping me to develop an independent seat and the ability to properly sit the trot. It has been long, slow work, and I'm really thankful that she took it on to make me a better rider. We are lucky to get to board at a friend's small private facility outside of Columbus, Ohio.

I know you're a NODA member, but you're also a member of another Ohio GMO, tell us what you get from each GMO. As a NODA member, I love the newsletter, the educational opportunities (like the Adult Dressage Camp! and online sessions), and the opportunity to connect with dressage riders from around the state. I made friends at NODA's camp in the summer of 2019 and have happily stayed in touch with several since then. I liked connecting with some of them at NODA's 2021 USEF/USDF recognized

show at Pure Gold and look forward to being together again at Pure Gold for Dressage Camp in 2021. I think NODA is a great GMO and appreciate the many times NODA leaders have answered my questions to help me make changes in Mid-Ohio Dressage Association.

I started as a member of Mid-Ohio Dressage Association and have served on the board as the treasurer since 2018. I'm also currently the membership committee chair and active on the show planning and education com-

mittees. I enjoy the work helping to build and support the dressage community in Central Ohio.

Tell us about your volunteer work and show management activities. I started volunteering at dressage shows in 2016 and quickly realized how much I LOVE to scribe! In 2017 and 2018, MODA was looking for members willing to learn more about supporting its USEF/USDF recognized shows by working in the show office. The work appealed to me and my professional experience was compatible, so I was hired by Show Secretary LLC in 2018. This has allowed me to support Susan Peacock as the show secretary for the Mid-Ohio Classic in July for the last few years. I have also been learning more about show management. This year I look forward to being the show secretary on site and show manager for TREA's Almost Heaven Dressage show, as well as an assistant show secretary at Region 2's Regional Championships in KY.

What challenges have you faced as an adult amateur and what have you done/what are you doing to overcome them? I am very blessed to have not faced any kind of extraordinary challenges as an adult amateur. I do appreciate the opportunity I was given when I received a Gifted Grant from The Dressage Foundation. Through that, I was able to afford a week of 10 lessons with my trainer. This was when we did a lot of the work on my seat. It's the only time I have been able to put my horse in a full training program, even just for a week. I will always be grateful to The Dressage Foundation for that and all the opportunities

they offer dressage riders year after year.

Tell us about showing in your first recognized show and how it went for you and Pippin? Pippin and I have been

showing at local Columbus area schooling shows since 2015. Since 2019 or so, I'd been thinking maybe it would be the year that I would ride in my first USEF/USDF recognized show. MODA added a new Level 1 show in September of 2021 that I am sure I'd like to compete in. I knew I would need another show to get enough scores for year end awards, so I was looking for a second one to do.

There are several shows at Brave Horse that I could have chosen but I was looking for a smaller, friendlier environment that would set us up for success. Pippin and I are both really anxious! I had already been aware of Pure Gold, since I am planning to attend NODA's camp there, so when I saw what judges were hired and I liked the dates, I decided to enter! We got a 62.857% on our very first time down centerline at a USDF/USEF recognized show, and I am very proud of us!

What do you do outside of horses? Professionally, I am a school librarian so have been an avid reader as long as I can remember. I love giving book recommendations! I am also a podcaster. My show is called "Enter at Neigh: a podcast for horse girls." I co-host with one of my dear friends who I met through MODA. I really enjoy jigsaw puzzles and

working creatively in a variety of mediums including paint and embroidery.

What advice would you give other adult amateurs?

I listen to Stacy Westfall's podcast about training horses, which I highly recommend. Just recently, I listened to an episode where she advised a listener to show up and ride even on days where you aren't at your best. When I'm having one of those days, I tell myself that it's OK to just get on and walk for ten minutes. Sometimes, I feel better once I'm in the saddle and end up doing more, but others I really do take a ten minute walk ride. I think Pippin appreciates that I'm not asking him to work as hard as possible every single time I get in the saddle.

Anything else you'd like to share?

Being active in GMOs and the dressage community have added such richness to my life! It has brought me some of my best friends and some of the events I

look forward to the most year after year. It may not fit into the time you have available right now, but when you can, I encourage everyone to get involved as much as they can. Dressage riders are a great group of equestrians, and you never know what you will learn or who you will meet.

Member Spotlight - Patty Keim

Interview by Mosie Welch

Tell us a little about Java Joe and your journey together.

I bought Java when he was 6 years old and I've had him the longest of any of my horses. Java Joe, aka Java, is an 18 y/o, Perch/TB, 17.1 hands, Dk Bay gelding. He and I evented together up through Novice Events and Training CT's. He was brave cross country but didn't have enough "go" to really want to eat up those fences and he was never really that careful in Stadium. In 2014, I decided to focus on dressage to see how far we could go. I love the challenge of all of the various movements. We've worked with some very talented and dedicated trainers who helped shape both Java and me – Francesca Nicoletti, Kristin Stein, and my current trainer Ali Weeks of Revelations Dressage in Richfield, OH. We've grown in our partnership over the years. I currently show him Intermediate 1 (I1) as well as an I1 Freestyle with some of my favorite artists who are Billy Joel, the Eagles, and Don Henley. I'm amazed at what Java has done for me and taught me and I'm grateful to be his mom.

Tell us a little about how you got into riding and how you became interested in dressage.

My father was a civilian working for the government and my family moved to West Germany for 4 years when I was 7 years old. While living there, I started riding lessons at a small German riding school in Zweibrücken which was a small town near the army base where we lived. I didn't know it at the time but I was taking dressage lessons! When I moved back to the US when I was 11 years old, I continued riding but at that time was doing the Hunters. In college I rode for the equestrian team at Kutztown University in Kutztown PA and also did Hunters. After college, I took a 15-year break from riding, and then got back into it when I was 36 years old and bought my first horse. I transitioned from Hunters into Eventing, moved to Ohio from Eastern PA, and owned a few different horses. When I decided to stop jumping and doing strictly dressage, I got hooked. I've been competing in dressage ever since.

What are your riding goals in 2021?

This year I'm focused on getting my gold medal and freestyle gold bar scores for Intermediate 1 on my horse Java. Qualifying for Regionals would be a plus but is not my main focus.

How long have you been a member of NODA and what board positions have you held?

I've been a member of NODA since 2015. I've been Silent Auction Chair, Banquet Co-Chair, Assistant Webmaster, member of the Education Committee (co-creator of Adult Camp and co-creator of virtual ride a test we offered in 2019 during Covid) and Recognized Show Chair.

How did you come to be co-manager of the Recognized Shows in 2021?

In 2020, I had volunteered to be a member of the Recognized Show committee, and as we know, the shows were canceled due to COVID. When it was time to start planning for the 2021 shows, I knew I would be able to commit more time to the shows since I had recently retired. The opportunity to be co-chair presented itself and I said YES. Managing a recognized show is also a pre-requisite I needed to meet in order to be able to apply to the USEF TD program which I hopefully will be doing later this year.

What did you bring to the table that gave you confidence to take on this leadership role?

I have organized and planned many events over the years using the project management skills I used in my real job as an IT project manager. For example, I've run an annual Silent Auction & Dinner for Golden Treasures Golden Retriever Rescue for about 15 years.

What are some behind the scenes planning and logistics that as a competitor you had no idea took place? Finding and contracting with all of the officials and staff for the events, planning for all of the required signage that recog-

nized shows are required to have (in particular all of the COVID signage), obtaining all of the sponsors for the shows – they make it possible for NODA to offer recognized shows.

What challenges did you face in managing your first recognized show? I would say there were 2 big challenges for me: I had never been on the recognized show committee before, so I had so much to learn about all of the moving parts of the shows and all of the work that goes into it. I also had to get up to speed very quickly on all of

the USEF/USDF show management rules. I've read more rules in the last 6 months than I have my entire riding life! Also, staying current on all of the USEF COVID-19 rules and expectations for running a show during the pandemic.

What kind of support did you receive from NODA and board members?

I had a wonderful committee of committed NODA members and board members who have served on the recognized show committee in the past and even chaired it. They all readily shared their knowledge with me and helped me with any questions I had. Also, of note, our volunteer coordinate Karen Shirring has been leading the volunteer effort for the Recognized shows for 30 years! Experience like that is invaluable on a working committee.

What were some highlights and challenges on show weekend?

Highlights were that our venue, Pure Gold Stables & Equestrian Center, was beautiful facility, our volunteers were wonderful and gave of their time so generously, and the weather was hot but lovely and we had no rain or storms that caused delays.

For me the challenge on show weekend was just trying to keep an eye on everything going on and ensuring I was available to help solve any issues that came up. Fortunately, everything went very smoothly.

What would you tell other members who are thinking about stepping up to take on a major NODA program, but are nervous?

I would tell them to go for it! There will be board members to support you and help you learn and grow along the way. We need people to step up into leadership roles so that we can keep the organization going strong into the future.

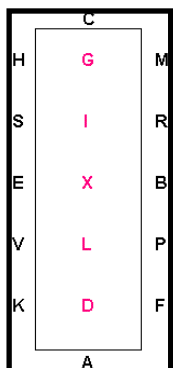

We all wish we had more time (and money!) to take more lessons. However most of us can't seem to find the time or extra funds to do so. Well, here is an opportunity to help get you the funds you need to have quality time with a trainer for 5-7 days. The Dressage Foundation's Gifted Memorial Fund for Adult Amateurs can help you jump start your training program,.

This Fund was seeded with donations received in special remembrance of Carol Lavell's great dressage horse, Gifted. Its purpose is to "give permission" to adult amateur riders to set aside quality time, in concentrated training, away from the daily pressures of job and family. The recipients will be able to spend time bonding with their horses; grooming them, giving them a spa bath, grazing them, as well as receiving lessons that they normally wouldn't be able to have. These grants are meant for adult amateurs to have the opportunity to be in an extended training situation that is different from his/her normal training plan. Grants will not be awarded for clinics, camps, competitions, or symposiums.

Volunteerism is an important requirement for these grants; preference is given to applicants who have strong volunteer history with their GMOs.

The best applications include a training program of 5-7 consecutive days with the same trainer. However, it is not required that you travel away from home. Training plans must have reasonable, attainable goals.

Up to nine \$1,500 grants are available each year (one in each USDF Region), plus two additional \$1,500 wild card grants (which can be awarded in any Region).
