### **Scholarships for AA & Youth and Grants for Professionals**

## Scholarships for Adult Amateurs & JR/Young Riders

Application Deadline October 1 of the Year PRIOR to the Scholarship Award.
October 2021 for use in 2022.

Each year NODA offers four (4) scholarships in the amount of \$250 each. Two (2) are designated for Junior/ Young Riders, and two (2) are designated for Adult Amateurs. An amateur member may be awarded a scholarship once every three years. If you apply and are not awarded a scholarship, please re-apply the following year.

Scholarship Use: Scholarships may be used for any educational dressage event. This includes all dressage clinics, seminars, symposiums, lessons, and other dressage education events.

### Applicant Forms and Qualifications for NODA Amateur Scholarships

- 1. **Volunteer Hours** Applicant must have completed a minimum of 8 hours of volunteer work during the year
  - a. Six (6) of the total volunteer hours must be with NODA. Remaining hours may be with NODA or any other or organization (horse-related or otherwise).
  - b. All volunteer hours must be documented and signed by an organization official
- 2. **Give Back Project** Applicant must be willing to complete a project to NODA if awarded a scholarship (Examples: Presentation to NODA Board/Community about your education experience or write an article for the NODA Newsletter.)
- 3. **Scholarship Application Packet** Applicant must complete and submit the following:
  - a. Junior/Young Rider Scholarship Application or -

#### Adult Amateur Scholarship Application

Application Responses to Questions 1, 2, and 3 must be typed)

- b. Volunteer Record
- c. Letter(s) of Recommendation Each applicant must

submit at least one (1) Letter of Recommendation. You may submit up to four (4) letters. The letter(s) must be from a credible source who is familiar with you as an equestrian or has worked closely with you on volunteer projects or in the classroom (i.e. your trainer, teacher, volunteer supervisor, boss).

Interested in understanding how freestyles are put together? Curious as to how choreography is gamified? Ready to listen to all kinds of music? Join Collier Wimmer owner of Three Wishes Freestyles for a two-day freestyle clinic. Whether you are keen on understanding freestyle theory, looking to create a freestyle or simply wanting to find music to ride to, all are welcome! There will be music, food, learning, and fun.

**Day One:** Starting in the morning with a lecture on her work process and freestyle philosophies, Collier kicks us off with a freestyle breakfast chat. Then each horse/rider combination will have 50-minute lesson with Collier. As she gets to know the pair, together they will start to find the perfect music.

**Day Two:** A 50-minute lesson serves as a deep dive in to the music selection from the first day, along with beginning to map out pieces of the choreography.

After the clinic, riders and auditors will have Collier's contact info if they wish to continue to work on their freestyle or have questions! Collier will send each rider their music selections and any choreography they worked on.

Below left: Mick Vonk attended camp with Teyha, her 8 year old gaited spotted saddle mare 14.3 hh. Teyha is Native American meaning "precious" and she is a Dark Bay Tobiano with Medicine Hat. Mick says "Teyha came into my life Oct 2020. Broke at 3, and only under saddle with 1 year of trail riding she stood in pasture for 3 years because owner didn't have time for her. I started riding her, working on developing her muscle tone and topline by exposing to her dressage. Teyha lives at home on our 6 acre ranch with my 25 yr old big hearted OTTB Shorty in Altoona, FL.

I started riding 20 yrs ago at Rocky River Stables with Valley Riding Inc. Participated in schooling shows with NODA, CADS and Dream On with Shorty. Seven years ago we moved to our 30 acre horse farm in western NY and then to FL. Teyha and I trail ride 2-3 times a week and train 2-3 times a week. Currently training consist of ground work, ground poles, arena work, lessons, drill team practice, or riding with friends at local covered arena. We belong to Altoona Trail Riders Club, trail riding and camping all over state of FL. So many beautiful preserves with lovely sand trails. Mosie Welch invited us to camp. We are here in Ohio until Oct 10.

Camp was a wonderful experience for Teyha's "baby green mind". Everyone was patient with us, especially being a gaited horse. I participated in all the lectures, yoga with Jill, lesson with Danielle introducing bend, ground pole lesson with Laura learning straightness and where our feet are, lesson with Barb engaging our back end, trail ride with Deb and Tassie, ride a test with Robin Birk who helped us by encouraging us to introduce exercises to improve gait on curves and circles. We stayed at KOA. Teyha improved each day finally being comfortable with horses coming and going leaving her alone in arena. Her willingness to learn and find relaxation each step of the way was amazing. Everyone was so nice which made the experience extra special.

Camp was a place that meets and greets you and your horse where you are at from a baby green mind horse to the experience of an I-1 dressage horse."

I have been riding as an adult for about 10 years, and have had a couple of other horses that didn't suit me. My little Sadie is not the perfect dressage horse, but I trust her with my life. We can go anywhere and do practically anything because she is unflappable, even though she definitely has her own opinions.

I rode a little as a child, and went to Miracle Mountain summer camp. Horsey activities all day, which is why I was so interested in Adult Dressage Camp, hoping to re-create my childhood fun. And it did! I took away valuable lessons from Barb, Danielle, Robin and Laura. Met great new people and greeted old friends. I took part in all of the activities offered, from yoga to lectures. I missed the farrier speak, because I was so tired that day. I won't miss anything next year! I loved the pole work with Laura and will be using the information at home.

In fact, I am already planning for next year's camp and can't wait to do it again"

Patty is one of the NODA Adult Dressage Camp Directors and Patty shares, "I am the co-creator of the camp along with my good friend Sally Burton.

Java and I have been together for 12 years. For the first 6 years I evented him up to the Novice level and then I decided to turn purely to dressage. I have been enjoying dressage ever since and have competed up through the Intermediate I level. My passion is doing freestyles with him because they are just so fun and you get to express yourself more than in a classical dressage test.

I took part in the dressage lessons, the ride-a-test, and the multiple educational sessions we offered. I also worked Java in a round pen to work on voice command transitions, rode daily on the galloping track to cool out after lessons, and did some trail riding for fun. All of the instructors at camp honed in our "normal" training issue which is that Java needs to be more active in his hind legs. We worked on excises to help make him more supple and quicker behind.

NODA's adult dressage camp is for EVERY level of rider. If you have ever wanted to attend a riding camp this would be a great one to try!"

Julie says, "I work for a wonderful non profit organization called Youthtowne as a riding instructor. Our lesson program focus on youth/teens. Lucky came to us to be a lesson horse through an auction house holding pen and was listed to ride and drive. Definitely not the best route to find a lesson horse, but last year was tough and with lessons closed for Covid I had some extra time. When I got his papers and tracked down his original owner/breeder I found out he was barely halter broke at 8 yrs. old. They had given Lucky to a man who said he wanted a trail horse but he was at an auction about 2 weeks later. Last spring we started from square one with a traumatized critter and it has been all about gaining trust and confidence.

I found NODA by accident this past January and loved the opportunities they offer, so I joined. I was excited to take Lucky to camp and give him new exposures in a low key environment. Lucky handled camp wonderfully. Despite our rocky start he's going to be a great addition to the lesson program with a bit more mileage.

Lucky and I rode in all of the lessons, and I audited as many as possible. There were good Q and A's with the clinicians and it was awesome to get their perspective on different topics. I would love to have participated in Yoga, but I had ride time conflicts.

The biggest "lightbulb moment" is to ride the horse I have now and not the horse I started under saddle last fall. He was so terrified of everything and I was stuck in that mode. He now has the confidence to take on bigger challenges and do really well and I need to help him do that. I Can't wait until next year!! Thanks to NODA and the hard work of Sally and Patty for organizing the camp!"

I've been in all the camps since NODA started doing it in 2019; I was always envious of the kid's camps and I'm so glad someone finally thought of doing something like that for adults.

As I was also riding my other horse for the Stone Gate Mini Trial, I missed a few of the lectures, but I did all my dressage lessons, took yoga in the morning, and got treated with Magnawave session (a blessing!).

Most of the feedback I received in my dressage lessons were around 'not rushing.' I'm so used to the speed of jumping that I push the horse in the dressage test like it's a 'jump-off.' I need to take my time and slow down.

As usual, it was a pleasure to be at camp! Looking forward to next year!"



I participated in NODA's dressage camp in 2019 and loved it. I was eager to work with all 4 trainers, two of whom I've had the pleasure of riding with before, but I also love the idea of dedicating days to improving my riding with like-minded individuals. It was basically a vacation to focus on dressage training, which is what I like to do when I have time off anyways.

Besides the training, I was also able to do Yoga on Saturday morning and take a trail ride on Saturday afternoon. My horse and I don't trail ride all that often, but I love it, so it was a special treat. And although I do yoga videos at home, I've never attended a live class. It was wonderful!

The trainers did a lot to increase my understanding of straightness, contact, and collection. A lot of that had to do with feel and is a bit hard to write about. An easier thing to describe is the work I did with Barb Soukup on two different movements from the first level test 3. Barb taught me to half halt and rebalance over X during the trot lengthening and to leg yield a stride or two to get a nice change of bend before picking up the right lead canter across the diagonal. Both will do a lot to improve my tests at our next show!"

I am so thankful for the friendships that I have grown and made through my two years at NODA's dressage camp!



Dressage camp. Tell us what your vision was when you were formulating the idea of adult camp. As a camp director for my school and many summers in my past, I am a huge camp fan. Patty Keim and I were talking one day about going away to a camp together with our horses. But we couldn't find a camp we wanted to go to- so we made one! Together we brainstormed how it could work, found a location, talked to trainers we admired who were willing to take on this challenge, created a budget, surveyed some friends to see if there was interest and then we approached the NODA board with our crazy idea. We had a lot of support but also some concern from the board that this idea wouldn't be as popular as we thought. It took some convincing but that first summer we got camp off the ground and we have filled our camp

each year (even the COVID year) with a lot of riders expressing interest in returning each summer.

What did it take to get Adult Dressage Camp up and running? Once we had approval from NODA, it was a matter of paperwork- hiring instructors and issuing contracts, working with venues, advertising, putting out registration forms, accepting payment and paperwork, making schedules, keeping within our budget, reporting progress to the board, communicating with the newsletter and website coordinators, emailing campers etc. The first year was a lot of work creating camp from the ground up and pestering friends to give it a try. Now camp sells itself. Now we just tweak and add or subtract based on how it went the previous year.

One thing I've noticed at camp is riders are at all levels and/or have physical challenges they are dealing with, how do you design camp so it works for everyone of us? What I love most about camp is that it is a place for everyone! Regardless of ability, breed of horse, or horse knowledge, everyone is welcome. We plan the weekend so that everyone gets their private lessons scheduled and the rest is up to the individual. We offer education sessions, additional lesson opportunities, fun and games, and lots of free time to audit lessons, trail ride, hang out with new friends or just relax and chat with other horsey people. There is no pressure to do anything. We are really thrilled with our instructors who come to camp as they are very easy to work with, and will go above and beyond to meet the needs of each individual rider. We

have had riders who are scared to ride and work on ground manners all the way through Intermediate competitors and all needs are met.

What moment at Camp 2021 stood out for you? This year was very special. I saw so many friends reach personal goals and have new experiences that they would not have had, so many big smiles and happy people. For me personally, it was riding in the Ride-a-test with Robin Birk. I get show nerves so badly that I typically just ride to survive and just get it over with - but for the first time I really was present. I thought about every single step he made and

felt like I was in control of my test. I loved it!

There were so many things you could do at camp, what did you take part in? I participated in almost everything. I also went on a trail ride with friends and rode daily around the track at Pure Gold.

What nuggets of wisdom did you take away from Adult Dressage Camp and More in 2021? I learned so much this year as I do each year and really feel that camp jump starts my riding! This year camp popped me out of a big funk I was in- with knee pain, with my riding, with life. Just being away with my horse and immersing myself in a community of people who have similar goals is so very therapeutic. Nugget: Take yourself out of your comfort zone and give new things a try, it will make all the difference.

I know you're already thinking about Adult camp 2022, any new ideas on the horizon? We are always planning for camp. We have lots of ideas and thoughts about what to keep and what to add on:) But for now it is all top secret!

Anything else you'd like to share? I so appreciate the support of NODA, our instructors and our sponsors who make this camp possible. But I am really thrilled that so many horse people take the risk each year and join us at camp. We can plan a great camp but without amazing campers it just wouldn't work well. I learn so much from everyone who attends and am just grateful that we can go each year.







The Chronicle Of The Horse had a wonderful article about The Dressage Foundation's Century Club and their 500th member, Helene DelleChiaie, and Finnian's Chase!. In the article, Helene was quoted in saying, "The Century Club inspires young people to realize that there are things they can achieve as a senior. It's never too late, and you're never too old."

The Century Club recognizes dressage riders and horses whose combined ages total 100 years or more. Horse and rider perform a test of any level at a show (schooling or recognized) or event and are scored by a dressage judge or professional. Western Dressage riders are also welcome to join the Century Club. Many of us started our riding careers later in life and worry we may not have a long riding career. The Century Club show us all that riding is not just for the young, but everyone.

According to The Dressage Foundation website, The Century Club was formed at The Dressage Foundation in 1996, at the suggestion of Max Gahwyler (CT), who with his horse Prinz Eugen, became team # 2 in the Century Club (pictured at the left). The first "Centurion Class" ride, held in 1996, featured Lazelle Knocke and her teammate Don Perignon. Lazelle's ride came after her extensive 'three year vacation' away from riding due to surgery and rehab time. As she said, "Hopefully the Centurion class will be in the forefront of a very interesting opportunity for Seniors and Dressage as Recreational and Therapeutic riding. It really is challenging and has long-term goals and benefits.

The Dressage Foundation's says of the Century Club, "The Century Club ride has evolved into a serious endeavor that encourages and rewards our older senior riders. The rider need not show everything at their level of ride, but it is important to show that rider and horse work well together. And while we stress the serious nature of riding a test, we want all senior riders for the Century Club to have fun! While this club has no dues, no meetings and no agenda, except to enjoy the occasion, many do keep in contact with the Foundation and with each other by email and phone.
