Recognized Show Volunteer Position, New Western Dressage Tests, Renew Your NODA Membership!

Recognized Show is Seeking an Understudy Volunteer Coordinator

NODA is looking for an understudy for this year's show (May 14-15,2022) to shadow the current Coordinator, Karen Eisenhauer-Shirring, who after 30 years, plans to retire soon. The understudy will then assume this key show committee position for next year and hopefully beyond.

Recognized Show Volunteer Coordinator Job Description

The primary function of this job is to recruit and schedule all the volunteers needed for the annual Recognized show, as well as manage them during the show. Much of this job is done online, so must be comfortable and familiar with computer programs and the internet.

The Coordinator works very closely with the show management team to ensure that all volunteer positions are filled. Setting up and publishing the online tool, SignUpGenius is the first step which needs to be done well in advance (at least 2 months) before the show. The site will require weekly monitoring and regular blast emails to the NODA membership to encourage sign up throughout the months prior to the show. The Coordinator is also responsible for ordering volunteer t-shirts or hats as well as distributing NODA bucks and arranging for volunteer lunches. The Coordinator job also requires writing a short spot for the program/newsletter to encourage members to volunteer and a "thank you" after the show.

The Volunteer Coordinator must be on the show grounds during the competition weekend as well as the day before to assist in the last minute preparations, such as but not limited to ring set up, stabling charts/assignments, and competitor check in.

Must be able to keep an accurate up-to-date volunteer schedule but be ready to make changes right up to the show as needed.

This is a really interesting job, although hectic at times. It offers the opportunity to meet everyone involved with the show and have first hand contact with the competitors. If you like being involved and can devote an hour or so a week for a couple months plus one fast-paced weekend at the show, this job is for you! Spotlight on Mary Lou Gallagher

Interview with Mosie Welch

How long have you been in NODA?

I had my first riding lesson in 1971. Several years later I met Margaret McElhany and started taking lessons from her. So I was introduced to dressage by 1980

What positions have you held?

I was secretary of the club for one term. My most important contribution to the club was running the NODA shows for over 30 years. My non-horsy life revolved around teaching so I was free each summer to ride and run a show or two. When I volunteered to do the schooling shows was handed a cardboard box containing a adding machine, some bridle numbers and not much else. There was no computer (much less a computer program) to schedule the rides and the only way riders could get their times was a phone call Friday night. Despite these limitations NODA's schooling shows grew from a one-ring program to the two ring competitions we have become accustomed to. By the time I stepped away from the schooling shows I had also started the October schooling show championship competition.

I "retired" from the schooling show management because the recognized shows were occupying most of my time. In 1988 Bev Mendocino and I thought it was a logical step for NODA to host a recognized show. Somehow we convinced Ridgewood Stables to scrape the grass off the side of a hill so we could have two rings. Before 1988 there had been a grand total of three recognized shows each summer in the entire state of Ohio so NODA 88 proved to be popular. Within a few years NODA outgrew Ridgewood Stables and moved the show to Chagrin Valley Farms. Eventually I also became the show secretary for Lake Erie College and Grand Haven Stables for several years.

How long have you been a Technical Delegate (TD) and at what level? I've been a TD for 25+ years. I thought my experience as a show secretary gave me a good background to become a technical delegate. I earned my small r TD license in the early 90's. Because most of my time was still tied up in secretarial jobs (and in teaching) I never had much opportunity to work towards becoming a large R TD. I'm not officially "retired" as a TD, but I let my license lapse during the pandemic.

Tell us a little about your riding career. Margaret McElhany introduced me to dressage in the late 70's but I never felt I really had a dressage horses until I bought Tiberius, aka "P-fred," a few years later. I think my first recognized show was Dressage 88 where I won three out of 4 First Level classes (yes, show secretaries could also compete in those days). A year or two later I rode on the winning team at Lake Erie's Dressage Prix de Ville. I had moderate success at Second Level, but found I enjoyed running the shows more than riding in them. I managed to show a few times at Third Level.

Entering a Recognized Show (Simplified?)

As I am writing this, I can see the wind turning 6 inches of snow into a knee-high drift by my door. So why am I writing about a NODA horse show that's four months away in May? Blame it on Covid--it ruined most of the 2020 show season and greatly affected show operations in 2021. Riders who were accustomed to wait until their arrival at the show to renew their memberships or handle other problems might have found their entry rejected. We don't know what 2022 will bring. The secretary's office may remain closed or severely limited to competitors. So now's the time to get all your paperwork in order.

I am starting with requirements for the horse because some things cannot be done online. All horses entered in the show must have 3 documents:

1. a Coggins test that has to be included with the entry form, a vaccination record and a USDF number for the horse. The Coggins must use the same name as will be found on the entry form. The Coggins test must be dated within 12 months of the show date and the vaccinations must be dated within 6 months. Schedule a vet appointment before May if either document is due to expire.

- **2. Vaccination records** are not included with the entry but must be bought with you to the show.
- 3. The USDF requires a horse identification number (HID) for all horses entered into a dressage show. (One important exemption – horses entered only in Introductory and/or opportunity classes do not need a HID.) The ID number will stay the same even if the horse if is later sold or upgraded to a Lifetime registration. Applications can be completed online if the horse has never been previously assigned a number. If you are an owner without a USDF number for yourself but are planning to become a member, I would suggest you go online to USDF and become a member first. Once you get your own USDF number, then go ahead and complete the horse's application for its HID. This can all be done within a week's time. Horses do not need to have a USEF number unless you plan on qualifying for regional championships. More about this later.

Matters become more complicated if you bought yourself a new horse that already has a USDF number. You will need to submit a Transfer of Ownership which cannot be completed online. The

USDF lists what documents can be submitted as proof of the new ownership, but the point is that these documents have to be mailed with the transfer to the USDF office. You need to get this done as soon as possible.


Now let's talk about requirements for the humans whose names go on the entry form. Since recognized shows can be an expensive proposition, I am going to offer 3 approaches to meeting your USEF and USDF Membership Requirements: a cheap way, a reasonable way, and a "let's go for it all" way. We'll start in the middle, the way most riders take.

- 1. For riders who plan to attend two or more Recognized Shows, but are not interested in qualifying for the Regional Championships, here's what you need to do.
- a. Join USEF.online. Annual membership fees for the USEF are \$80 while the Show Pass fee for nonmembers is \$45 per show. Simple math will tell you that two non-member fees will cost more than the membership itself. An added bonus for amateur riders is that the USEF Amateur Card comes free with the membership—and you must have an Amateur Card to enter any class designated as "adult amateur".
- b. Complete the SafeSport program. Since 2019, all members of the USEF who have passed their 18th birthday and now enter a recognized show (whether as a rider, owner, trainer and/or coach), must first complete the SafeSport program before being eligible to compete. A new member of USEF, will have to finish a core program that will take about 2 hours to complete. Participants renewing their membership will take a shorter refresher course every year. These programs can be accessed online. Google "Accessing the Required SafeSport Training" to find detained information for both the core and refresher modules.
- c. Join NODA (or any of the other Group Member Organizations of the USDF) Part of your NODA membership fees pay for a USDF Group Membership (a USDF requirement). This group membership allows you to participate in USEF/USDF recognized shows without paying a USDF non-membership fee (\$25 per show). Group members can still submit their scores for the USDF Rider Award programs such as Rider Performance awards or the Bronze Medal. Make sure that you join NODA now. You won't have an active membership until your NODA membership is forwarded to the USDF office. Don't wait until May.
- d. **Apply for a USDF HID for your horse.** You will not need any USEF number for the horse.
- e. **Owners and Riders.** If you are not the owner of the horse you are showing, then the owner must have the same USEF/USDF memberships listed above (or pay the non-member fees) and the horse must have a

USDF HID in the name of the actual owner. If two or more people own the horse, only one of the owners must be a member to avoid paying the non-member fees. When filling out an entry form, make sure you list the owner who is the member.

- 2. For those riders who plan to ride in the Regional Championships, things become more complicated and expensive.
- a. **Join the USEF.** Non-members may not attempt to qualify for Regionals.
- b. Complete the USEF SafeSport program. See above
- c. Apply for a participating membership in the USDF. A group membership does not make you eligible to qualify. You can sign up online and your membership number will remain the same as your group membership
- d. Get a USDF lifetime registration for the horse. If your horse already has a HID, then you only have to pay for the upgrade. The horse number itself will remain the same—just the status has changed.
- e. **Get either a USEF Annual or lifetime recording for the horse.** Some horses may have a free USEF HID but it won't let you qualify for regional championships.
- f. **Owners and Riders.** The owner must have the same USEF/USDF memberships as the rider. The owner must also have the horse listed with both the USEF and USDF in his/her name.
- g. **Regional Championships.** If you had not originally planned to qualify for the Regionals and later change your mind, you can always apply for the USDF participating membership on line as well as upgrade your USEF and/or USDF HID numbers. This can be done online but scores earned previously to these changes will not count for qualification.
- **3. Opportunity Classes.** A relatively cheap choice now exists for the riders who do not want to spend lots of money this year but want the chance to participate in the recognized shows. The way to avoid membership and/or HID fees would be to sign up for only Opportunity Classes. Shows in our area will generally be offering opportunity classes per day at Introductory, Training Level and First Level. These classes must have the word "Opportunity" in the title. When you enter only these classes and/or the USDF Introductory (Walk-Trot) classes, you are exempt from all non-member and horse registration fees. The downside of the Opportunity classes is that the results will not count for any USEF or USDF award programs. The NODA Board, however, has voted to allow these scores to be used for schooling show awards.

Memberships and horse registrations can be confusing. Hopefully this article has helped you complete your entry form in time for the opening day of entries.



Dressage4Kids with Lendon Gray Recap By Jennifer Cooper, Junior/Young Rider Liaison

NODA and Lake Erie College hosted a Dressage4Kids TEAM Clinic with Lendon Gray, Oct. 29-31, 2021. The TEAM clinic (Training, Education And Mentoring), was filled with riding and lecture/learning experiences for eleven junior riders, while the Friday adult clinic focused just on riding for ten lucky riders.

The weekend started for me on a Thursday night trek to the airport to collect Lendon and

bring her to her hotel. Having never met before, there were many texts for pickup and she was safely dropped at the Holiday Inn Express on Crile Rd. near Lake Erie College's George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center. I coordinated the event as the Jr/YR Liaison for NODA working with Elizabeth Scalabrino the 2021 Education Chair. As a parent of a youth rider, I also saw the weekend from different perspectives, wearing two hats!

Friday Elizabeth took the management lead, so I had more time to watch and learn. Lake Erie's Catering, Metz, provided wonderful boxed lunches for all auditors, riders and volunteers. All riders worked on weaknesses in their riding, and some had some interesting quirks. One horse loved to hang out a tongue, which can get dinged in the show arena. Lendon and the rider tried to figure out when and why without a full answer. Most of the adults were thrilled to have this experience and asked for photos with Lendon after their ride. All riders were beautifully turned out and many levels of competition were present. After a quick clean up, and the quick drive back to the hotel, day one was over for most, but our family now had to get all our tack, equipment and horse to the venue. We nestled in among the other junior participants and got to know them. Five riders attend LEC, with only two bringing their own mounts from home. Four members of NODA participated, and there were three other participants, the farthest from southern Ohio. Many were washing and braiding their mounts getting ready for the early 7 am start.

Saturday, Lendon let the participants know that they had to wrap, hopefully in white polos, and be braided and reminded them there was a quiz to take as she gave out a D4K pin and folder. The first rider was already in LEC's beautiful indoor and Lendon was off and teaching! Lunch

Oils can be used for show stress in people, but check the rules for horses! At lunch, Jeni Gaffney, DVM, discussed equine emergency medicine with a great slide show. Then Jacqueline Boonekamp De Wit introduced us to Joker, the simulator horse that helps riders experience and learn the correct body movements for riding.

The afternoon went quickly and we had time for a group photo before tearing down the dressage ring together. Everyone performed more in-depth movements/exercises/gaits on the second day after Lendon found their baseline the first day. All rose to the occasion and tried their best. Most performed more harmoniously the second day after internalizing what was practiced the first. There was a wide variety of skill levels, riding levels and horses at the NODA LEC D4K event, and all were very thankful to everyone who made this possible. Part of the student's clinic experience was to practice gratitude by writing a quick thank you to all lecturers, coordinators, and facilities.

I was sad it was over and this keeper of horse knowledge was only in my life briefly to share her wisdom. As we parted ways at her hotel near the airport, Lendon gave me a big hug (regardless of Covid), cute D4K car cup holder coasters, and a personal thank you note for taking such great care of her over the weekend. I felt warm and happy for representing NODA well and for all the young riders who participated.

NODA hopes to do a D4K Team Clinic every other year, and hopefully in the spring so riders can use what they learned for their showing season!


