Category: Signatures On a Recognized Show Entry Form

For \$100, the answer is: The last thing you must complete on your entry form:

Question: What is "sign your entry form?"

For \$1000, the answer is: The hardest thing you must complete on your entry form.

Question: What is "sign your entry form correctly?"

Riders generally are aware that three signatures for rider, owner and trainer are needed on entry forms. However, at almost every show there will be an amateur's entry without a signature for trainer. When questioned, the rider might state that his/her instructor wasn't coming to the show. Another frequent excuse involves the amateur's mistaken belief that signing as trainer would result in the loss of his/her amateur status. After all, isn't a trainer the professional who gives us lessons?. Probably the most misunderstood word in the USEF rule book is trainer. GR148 defines the trainer as an adult who has the responsibility for the care and custody of the horse. A clearer job description might be guardian or custodian of the horse's well-being while on the show ground. If a veterinarian is needed, it is the trainer who will authorize the treatment.

A Junior rider under the age of 18 cannot be listed and/or sign as trainer. An adult must be named. If the junior's parents will be at the show with their child, they may list themselves as trainer and sign the entry form without having to pay a non-member fee. (I would suggest that when parents sign as trainer, they add the word parent after their signature). If the parents are not listed as trainer, one of the parents must still sign as parent/guardian on the appropriate line. The junior's instructor will often then be designated as trainer. In this case the instructor must be a USEF member or pay the non-member fee. Once a junior rider turns 18, he/she may sign as trainer,

For some riders difficulty occurs when the owner is not available for a signature. Although this problem mainly affects professionals with out-of-state clients, even amateurs might find it difficult to get the owner's signature. The rider, whether amateur or professional, can sign his/her own name in place of the owner and include the phrase "agent for owner" on the line. This does not

mean the owner can avoid membership fees or requirements of the Safe Sport program. So the owner's membership numbers must still be listed on the front of the entry form but the rider can sign on the reverse.

If three signatures are needed, why is there a fourth line for a Coach? The coach is a professional who gets paid for lessons or training. (As explained above, this is not to be confused with the trainer.) A coach's signature is not required. However, if you depend upon the coach's help at the show, this year you might want to have your coach sign the entry form. Covid 19 protocols have statde that a rider's support crew is limited to two people and spectators are not permitted. So if youwant some sort of guarantee that your coach will be allowed on the show grounds, list your coach's name and USEF number on the front of the entry and get the signature on the reverse.

The last hurdle the rider faces is getting all these signatures to the show secretary. In the good old days, riders would fill out the entry form, get the necessary signatures on the back, make a copy of the Coggins, put everything in an envelope and then mail everything to the secretary. Most riders now are used to entering online and plan on actually signing when they arrive at the show. Covid protocols might not allow entrance to the show

office. If incomplete entries will not be accepted, what is the frantic rider supposed to do? If you can find your way around computers, scan the signature page and save it on your computer. Do the same with the Coggins and, if needed, the evidence needed for proof of eligibility in freestyle classes. Online entry programs will allow you to attach these necessary documents to your entry. For the rest of us, the technically challenged, you can still enter online. You will need to mail a copy of the signature page and Coggins to the show secretary. Also include a cover sheet that clearly states the name of horse and rider as well as the name and date of the show(s) you have entered. **One last piece of advice - do not wait until the last minute!**

You need a complete and accurate entry.

Don't make it a "Final Jeopardy"

THAT is not a good thing for the NODA recognized shows or ANY recognized show!

Inside the USDF

We started the year with a zoom call with Lisa Gorretta to learn about the USDF. Lisa did an incredible job explaining the hierarchy at USDF, the history and her lifetime of involvement. Just a small sample of the important information we learned:

US equestrian is the governing body for all equestrian sports (44 affiliates) and is in charge of regulations, competitions, drugs and medications.

USDF is responsible for the promotion of dressage, the recognition of achievement and education. So in order to show in a recognized dressage show you need to join both organizations.

USDF has 31 full time paid staff but could not operate without many volunteers at all levels of the organization, from GMO's to Region directors to National directors. Volunteering is a wonderful way to support dressage.

USDF has many educational opportunities that are available on usdf.org that we have available to us. Look into it.

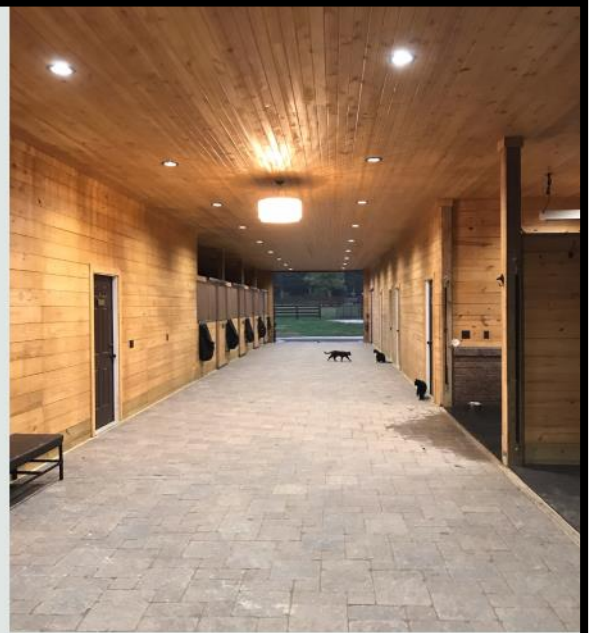

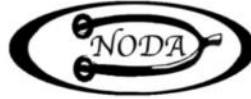

BITS of BALANCE – Biomechanics From the Foot Up

An overview of lessons with Jacqueline Boonekamp De Wit and Joker, her simulator horse

Jacqueline Boonekamp De Wit has a great eye. She can spot what you need to fix the moment your behind hits the saddle on Joker, her simulator horse.

Jacqueline was kind enough to bring Joker to Lake Erie College for the NODA/LEC sponsored D4K event in October 2021. After watching her work with a rider there, and learning about what she does with biomechanics, I decided to book lessons for my daughter, Josie, and myself.

Josie and I had an excellent time riding Joker with Jacqueline and learning more about proper body alignment. She really makes you think about you and not your horse. The simulator, Joker, doesn't compensate for your balance issues!

We decided to bring our own saddle to make sure we sit right in what we have at home, but Jacqueline has a great saddle for all to use as well. We signed our waivers, donned our riding gear, and I climbed aboard Joker. There is no girth, so you need to balance and not hang onto the saddle while you mount. Nor can you step into the stirrups as you usually mount!

Jacqueline started by placing the foot. When you build, you start with the foundation, and the foot is just that. She stated that you should be standing straight up as you ride. If the horse was pulled out from under you, you should be left standing! The stitching should be straight across the front top row area of your boot parallel with the stirrup and keep heels out to help keep your foot and toes forward. This made me feel like I was pushing in with the knee, and I know we are to keep our thigh and calf on. Jacqueline said this too at the beginning, but this rotation helped with alignment.

I loved Jacqueline's use of her term "your meats" meaning your thigh and or bum. We need to adjust our "meats" when we get on to get the right part of our legs and buttocks on the horse and relaxed in the right place. Also with relaxation, Jacqueline brought up the thought that as we contract one side of our leg muscles, the other side lengthens and relaxes. She had me push out with my ankles and feel the outside of my leg tense and then think about how my inside felt – looser and more able to apply when needed to the horse's side. The muscles can also go back to a "neutral" position better after stressing the oth-



er way.

We then discussed the seat. Jacqueline said that it should hold water and not spill any. I had heard wine from my trainer, so about the same...for my normally over curved/arched back, I had to draw my core back and "bring my sternum to my pelvis" which lifted my ribcage up and brought my shoulders forward so much so that I kind of felt like I was in 2-pt. position. However, gazing

over to the mirror, I was perfectly aligned shoulder over hip over heel. Wow, it felt weird!

Josie just needed to roll her pelvis. Her feet were a little in front and when she just brought her shoulders a little forward – perfect alignment!

We dealt with the hands a little too. Using a resistance band under my legs and around the saddle and back to my other hand, Jacqueline had me pull up and away from me, as I have a tendency to drop my hands. We used this in the walk, sitting trot, and posting trot. As I was pulling up and forward on the bands, I was instructed to think about dropping my elbows for better position too.

Josie's hands needed to push forward more and not take on the reins. She reminded Josie to feel her core with the bands by contracting her core away from her hands.

After the lesson, I felt like I wasn't as messed up with my body as I thought! There is hope and a foundation to work from with a few new tools for my riding toolbox and thoughts to consider for a more harmonious ride.

Thank you Jacqueline!

Jacqueline's owns Bits of Balance, LLC, based out of Rocky River Stables. She is a Dutch equestrian with 30+ years of experience. She learned to ride at a local riding school where she also successfully competed. It was when she started working at private, high-end dressage barns, that she developed more passion for dressage. Jacqueline regularly travels "back home" for additional training and coaching and got in touch with a Dutch horse simulator several years ago. After using it personally, she realized how beneficial it could be to riders of all skill levels and disciplines. She purchased one herself and is the first to introduce it in a lesson program in the USA. She is thrilled to bring this opportunity to the Cleveland area! Find out more at bitsofbalance.com/



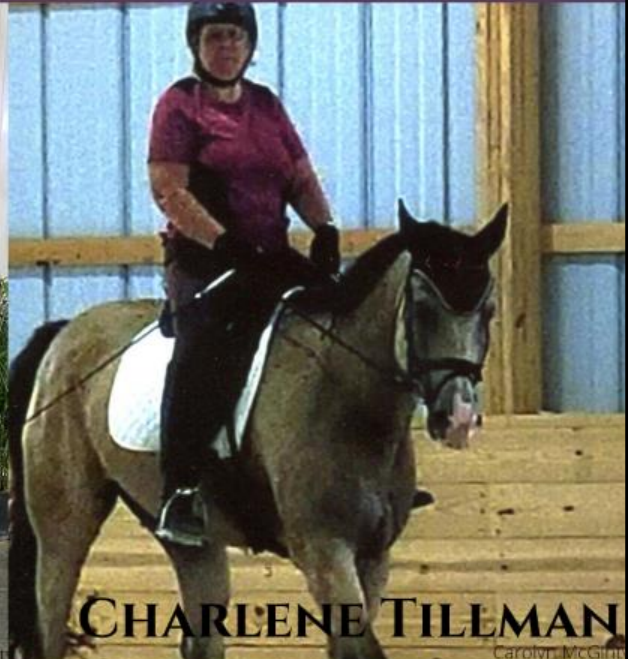

Check List for Freestyle Riders

Read and Know the Rules!

Before you sign up for a freestyle make sure to read the USDF Freestyle Rules and Guidelines. USDF Freestyles Training through Fourth Level follow USEF Dressage rules. Most Freestyle rules are under **DR 129 Musical Freestyle**.

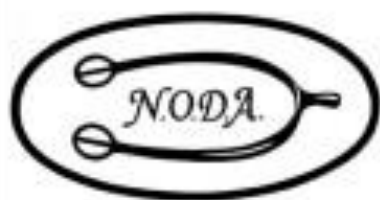
Quick Check List for Freestyle

- Your music should be saved in either WAV or WMA format. Please do not submit your music in MP3 format!
- The CD should have only the freestyle ride on it. It should be clearly labeled with the competitor's name, horse's name, and level of ride.
- Always bring an extra copy of the music to the competition. Mark it in the same way as the original, plus some additional notation indicating that it is a backup copy. **ALWAYS HAVE IT READILY AVAILABLE.**
- Consult the competition prize list for information about sound checks and to whom the CD should go.
- Make sure to go to the sound check! Check the music near the judge's stand and at the farthest end of the arena. Make sure the judge can hear the music but that it is not so loud that the judge will not be able to communicate with their scribe or that the music is distorted.
- If there is a problem with the music during the test, it is up to the rider to ask that the test be stopped. The judge or announcer may not know that there is something wrong with your music. This could include the announcer playing the wrong music, the music skipping or the sound system failing. Ask permission to stop the test as soon as you noticed any issue with the music. Reference USEF DR 129.6d below. You will not be allowed to re ride the test if you do not stop the test prior to the end. Judging must restart at the point of interruption. In any case, the marks already given will not be changed.**

USEF Rules Freestyle Riders Need to Know:

- **Reference DR129.6a:** Music is to be presented to competition management on a compact disk (CD) at least two hour prior to the start of the class.
- **Reference DR129.6b:** Sound checks must be provided to riders in Freestyle classes for no fee, either on the day prior to competition or prior to their scheduled class. The requirements and timetable for scheduling sound checks must be published in the prize list.
- **Reference DR129.6c:** Each rider will be permitted one representative in the sound system booth to supervise the handling of the CD if so desired by the competitor.
- **Reference DR 129.6d:** In case of rider's music failing before or during a Freestyle Test and in cases where there is no backup system, the rider can, with permission of the judge at "C", leave the arena or start at a later time. There should be minimum interference with the starting times of the other riders and the affected rider should return to complete or restart his/her test during a scheduled break in the competition or at the end of the competition. The rider may decide whether to restart the test from the beginning or to commence from the point where the music failed. Judging must restart at the point of interruption. In any case, the marks already given will not be changed.

The Dressage Foundation's Carol Lavell Gifted Memorial Fund Awards \$22,500 To Adult Amateur Riders

The Dressage Foundation (TDF) announces 15 recipients of its Carol Lavell Gifted Memorial Fund for Adult Amateurs who will each receive a \$1,500 grant to enable them to set aside quality time in concentrated training with their horse.

Typically, up to 11 grants are available each year—one per United States Dressage Federation Region and two wild card grants. However, thanks to generous donors, a total of 15 grants were awarded this year. "We received a record number of Gifted Fund applications from adult amateurs and are happy to 'answer the call' by awarding a record number of grants," said Jenny Johnson, TDF's Executive Director. "Additional grants were awarded in Regions 5 and 7 in memory of Sue Curry, then our Board approved two more wild card grants, also in Sue's memory. We are honored to remember Sue in this special way and are grateful to all the donors."

This Fund was seeded with donations received in special remembrance of Carol Lavell's great dressage horse, Gifted. Its purpose is to "give permission" to adult amateur riders to set aside quality time, in concentrated training, away from the daily pressures of job and family. These grants are meant for adult amateurs to have the opportunity to be in an extended training situation that is different from his/her normal training plan. Grants will not be awarded for clinics, camps, competitions or symposiums. **Applications for this grant is due 9/15/2022.**
