NODA's Dressage Professional Initiative with Richard Williams

After a conversation with NODA's president, Danielle Menteer, I was eager to sign up for the two-day inaugural ness of riding and training horses. Dressage Professional Initiative (DPI) with Richard Wil**liams sponsored by NODA.** Spending two days with other dressage professionals while participating in lectures, networking, and mounted sessions sounded like a great way to recharge my enthusiasm after a long, cold winter. I signed up for this clinic to learn! There is so much to learn in life and especially in this sport of dressage, taking advantage of every opportunity is vital. There are many avenues to equestrian adventure, and one of them is networking with other professional, so I came into the DPI super excited to expand my knowledge.

Over the two-days I was lucky to spend time with a great **group of dressage professionals.** It was awesome to chat and watch each other's rides! I loved being in a group

where we could all really relate to each other. Robin Birk, small r Judge, instructor and competitor has provided insight to NODA riders through her ride-a-test clinics, judging at competitions, and will provide instruction to campers at 2022's Dressage and More Camp for Adult Riders.

The Shannon Foundation Board of Directors, at the request of dressage professional Julie Shannon (GA), established these grants at TDF in 2016. As a successful instructor and trainer, Julie saw the need to help dressage judges who are interested in moving up the levels, to create a strong pipeline of judges in the United States. The purpose of the Shannon Foundation Fund for Judges' Licensing is to provide financial support for dressage judges to participate in activities related to obtaining a judging license of 'recorded' (small r) or higher.

Richard focused a lot on the process of a lesson and how to address different riders and how to teach them. He also is an advocate for the principal that us trainers can and should work together and help one another out. And he emphasized that through everything we do with horses, safety must always come first! During classroom lecture we discussed various aspects of a good seat including sitting in the middle of the saddle. When I rode Kahlua in the mounted sessions, I focused on sitting in the middle of my saddle. With that one focus during the mounted session, I felt the difference in my horse because I was better able to engage my right seat bone and the right side of my body. Kahlua responded and I felt a straighter and better moving horse under me.

Richard discussed that being clear with the horses and riders is always for the better. Every little change you ask for or word that you use can change how things progress in a lesson or training session. With your riders, pay attention to how you are talking to them and the words that you are using. What is important is to relate to the student and keep the positivity in the situation while ensuring the safety of both horse and rider. Richard is a strong proponent of the philosophy that an instructor's job is to help a horse and rider pair become their best within their abilities and always be an advocate for the horse.

When we moved from the classroom to the arena, Richard demonstrated during each professional's ride how he goes through the process of teaching a lesson. Initially Richard says he asks about the pair and then just sits and listens to the rider which helps him understand where the rider is coming from. Then moves through the lesson using that information and what he sees to benefit the rider more than if he just watched them go and didn't have any dialogue. As the ride progresses, he continues picking up on what the rider is saying. So always remember when your client is talking, they are sharing important information you can use to help them. Dialogue between rider and trainer is very important.

NODA is planning to hold several more Dressage Professional Initiative clinics with Richard Williams in 2022 for the purpose of bringing NODA member professionals together to learn and network. The focus of this session was teaching an effective lesson. Hopefully as time goes on, we'll dive into other aspects of the sport – such as the business side and other topics of mutual interest. If you are a professional that was not able to make it this time, of course, you should sign up when the opportunity presents itself! I always tell my students that auditing or riding in a clinic or participating in any educational event allows a rider to hear things in a different way that may res-

onate and change the rider's understanding or riding for the better. You will always pick up something up from anything you do, so it's worth the two days to clear even on thing up! I urge you to stay tuned for details on the next Dressage Professional Initiative.




#### **An Evening With Richard Williams**

Lecture Review and Photos by Sally Burton, NODA's Education Co-Chair

On Wednesday, April 20, NODA hosted an evening lecture with Richard Williams of Williams Dressage, Franktown, Virginia. Richard was recommended by our president, Danielle Menteer, as an excellent instructor and student of dressage. Within minutes of when he began to speak, we understood why Danielle considers him a mentor and friend.

Richard started off his lecture reminding us that we must learn from each other. He considers himself still a student of dressage after an entire career in the sport and said he was excited to learn from us. Every time you ride there is an opportunity to learn- from the horse, from yourself, from each other. As the talk continued we were thrown many "nuggets of wisdom." Richard is a fan of three word sayings. The following are just some of the 'take aways" that spoke to me.

**Rider rides horse.** The subject of the sentence is rider. So we need to make sure that our work is around us. It is the

rider who directs what happens with our attitude, our knowledge, our willingness to improve. The horse is the object of the sentence and the reactions of the "object" depend on us. Instead of blaming the horse, think about the subject, the rider.

**Find a good teacher.** The teacher could be the horse (school master), a trainer, a friend or an instructor. A good Sit in the middle. Sit in the middle of the horse, equal teacher learns from you and will meet you where you are on that day, at that time. You cannot learn if there are things that get in your way either mentally or physically and you must work those out first. You also need to act

like a teacher to get ahead- if you don't know something, ask, read about, watch videos, or research. Do not rely on someone to tell you everything, figure it out.

Riding is body- mind- spirit. Your emotional state is so important. Your horse picks up on your emotions. Richard suggested finding a physical place near the barn where you can leave your worries behind. As you walk past the tree by the door to the barn (or wherever is convenient), park your problems there. Then when you walk into the barn you will "give yourself a gift" of time with your horse without outside concerns. Only when you are present can you really improve.

Be Here Now. Be who you are, don't be ashamed of your progress and what you can do right now. Live it and move



forward. Do not dwell in the past or what could happen. Be in the now. "Breathe- inhale, exhale, repeat, indefinitely." Connect your breath with your posturebreathing in deeply puts you in your seat. Do not fret about details, just breathe.

**Use the Force.** Use the most powerful force to your advantage: gravity. Do not fight it. Allow gravity to pull you deep into the seat, to align your body in a straight posture. To lengthen your legs, drop your elbows. Sit tall and grow from your center.

distance side to side and back to front. Become the movement of the horse- do not try to sit the trot- but put yourself in the middle of the trot and let your body join the movement. Become more horse like-ride from your

core (the horse moves from his core) and connect to the horses midsection. Lunge lessons will improve this skill.

Watch your Self- talk. Watch how you talk about yourself and what you say to yourself. Do not label. Live in the state of your mind and make up your mind to improve. Riding is where we can grow as a person- it is a special place!



**Do one thing at a time.** Once you have accomplished that, do the next right thing. If you want to be better you need to do things differently. So try not to multitask but to concentrate on one thing and then move on.

The most important skill a rider can have is to NOTICE. Notice what you are doing, how the horse reacts and then replicate that feeling if it was right or fix it if it wasn't.

And finally, never lose sight of WHY you ride!


