All horses must be on the property with riders ready for opening remarks by Lendon at the start time on the first day (usually 8 am) and horses and riders MUST remain onsite through the hours of the event each day for auditing other riders' lessons, guest lecturers at lunch and after/before rides.

Education Report for Dec 2023

We had a very busy year in NODA Education! We started with the **New Test Clinic** at the Bainbridge Library on January 7, 2023. Over 40 participants from as far away as Pittsburgh came to hear Margaret Freeman discuss all the new tests. A delicious lunch from Honey Baked ham kept us fueled for the 7 hour day of amazing information and insights.

March 15 we offered a **Learn to Scribe Clinic** with Barb Soukup also at the Bainbridge Library. 14 people attended, learning all about the art of scribing. We played videos and Barb "live scored" so that everyone could practice scribing. This was a very fun event full of laughter, funny tales of showing "incidents" and support for new scribes.

Year two of the **Dressage Professionals Initiative** kicked off April 16-17 with Jen Baumert from Wellington, Florida. Part one was hosted by Endeavor Farm and 11 professionals attended and worked together to learn more about teaching. Since we had Jen in town we hosted **An Evening with Jen Baumert** on April 16, also at Endeavor Farm. 15 plus local dressage enthusiasts turned up to hear all about her career, the highs and lows of the sport and to learn tidbits of information from the mind of a well-known professional. **Our last event was also the Dressage Professionals Initiative part 2 with Jen Baumert**, September 30-October 1 at Flow Equestrian with 6 enthusiastic pros At this session some amateur riders brought horses to learn from an instructor other than their regular teacher.

Next up on the Education program was our annual four day NODA Dressage Adventures and More. This year we moved the program to Brecksville Stables. Riders were thrilled with dressage instruction from Barb Soukup and Danielle O'Donnell. The fun continued with Working Equitation lessons taught by Emily Gill. This is a very popular program and we are looking forward to our return next year to Brecksville.

On July 29 we hosted a **Ride-a-Test Clinic** with Barb Soukup. This day included a new twist- you could ride with your instructor coaching you via electronic device. Some riders chose this option and found it very helpful. This day was full of education about the specifics of test riding and participants came away with many new insights.

As the year ends we would like to thank every participant who joined us on our education journey. Special thanks to all the instructors and clinicians. Finally, we could not run these events without the wonderful venues that support all of our endeavors. Stay tuned for more Education in 2024.

a "regular volunteer" and 6 as
Volunteer Chairman of the
Organizing Committee (OC) for
the competition, which is
more of a 10 month gig.



Over the years I've had the opportunity to do everything from equipment check to

crossing guard in the drizzle in the first few years to my current role. Currently my work includes ensuring that all of the parts work in sync, that each person has sufficient support without interference.

I run the meetings of the U. S. finals Organizing Committee and coordinate with our primary staff liaison Krystina Wright. I review hospitality plans with Anne Kuhns who heads that part of the Finals. Each year there is a review and sign off on the gifts, apparel, and swag. I also review the current site map, rings we will need, and class schedules with the Show Manager Debra Reinhardt. I'm also responsible for the final approval of all officials. Of course there is a budget and it requires review with the Executive Director and USDF President.

During the U.S. Finals I generally troubleshoot to support any portion run by Debra, Anne, Kathy, Bettina (secretary) and staff that require help, ideally without getting in anyone's way. I'm there to greet the 6 AM people and horses when I open the overhead Alltech doors. Sometimes I am scheduled to be in awards ceremonies it is always great to congratulate our 10th to first place ribbon winners! After the fact I review evaluations from volunteers, competitors, and officials with the whole Organizing Committee to see what we might improve upon each year.

The Finals are such an important event for the membership and the sport. It is a unique event in the U.S. in that is the head to head culmination of the results of the regional championships program. It was the dream of George Williams, Janine Malone and the late Lloyd Landkamer - all friends and mentors to me. I will pass on these responsibilities sooner than later, however I am sure I will continue to volunteer in some capacity.

Horse People - A Unique Breed

We are truly a special breed! I've been called a horse person by many people including family, non-horse friends, and even my Chiropractor! How many times have we needed a new pair of paddock boots, but our horses needed new shoes, or a vet treatment and we made our paddock boots last a little longer so our horse could get what they needed? Many times, we joke that if we knew that buying a horse was the least expensive part of owning a horse, would we rethink our decision? I don't know about you, but my answer is NEVER!!

Don't you wish you had a Fairy God Mother that would magically give you money to advance your Dressage education? Well, there is - The Dressage Foundation! It wasn't until I became The Dressage Foundation Liaison for NODA that I learned what was available in grants to help. Whether you are a Youth/Young Adult, Adult Amateur, Trainer, or involved in show management, there are grants available to you.

Many of these grants were created in memory of people that spent years in the dressage world and wanted to help others continue their journey in the sport of Dressage. The Carol Lavell's Fund named in remembrance of her great dressage horse "Gifted" is to "give permission" to adult amateur riders to set aside quality time to concentrated on training. Up to nine \$1,500 grants are available each year (one in each USDF Region), plus two additional \$1,500 wild card grants. Wouldn't an extra \$1,500 help toward your training?

There are many grants available that you can apply for in 2024.

Also, don't forget about The Dressage Foundation's Century Club. Riding doesn't have to stop when you reach a certain age, and The Dressage Foundation celebrates the riders that continue to ride despite their age. The Century Club recognizes dressage riders and horses whose combined ages total 100 years or more. Horse and rider perform a test of any level at a show (schooling or recognized) or event and are scored by a dressage judge or professional. Western Dressage riders are also welcome to join the Century Club. An application (found under the "Join the Century Club" heading) should be completed and sent to the Foundation at least two weeks prior to the ride. The Dressage Foundation (TDF) will send a beautiful black and gold ribbon to be presented to the team at the show. Following the ride, TDF sends a Century Club plaque to the new team.

Grants are awarded throughout the year and have application deadlines. Don't wait until it is too late, go to The Dressage Foundation's website at www.dressagefoundation.org/grants-and-programs/apply/ to find out more!

The Dressage Foundation is a 501(c)(3), non-profit, tax-exempt, donor-driven organization that is dedicated to educating, supporting, and advancing the sport of dressage. 
