Becoming a USEF Licensed Technical Delegate

NODA congratulates member, Patty Keim, who has competed all the steps and training necessary to become a USEF licensed "r" Dressage Technical Delegate.

Patty shares a little about her experience below.

This means I can be hired to be a TD at Dressage shows that are level 1, 2 or 3. I can work alone at these shows. I'm also able to be hired and work along side an "R" TD at level 4 or 5 shows (such as Regionals or Finals). I'm looking forward to serving in the role of TD and my first official show will be the Prix de Villes at Lake Erie College in April. Hope to see you there!

Here is the info on the process I went through to get licensed over the past 2 years. In order to become a USEF TD, I first had to complete certain prerequisites in order to be able to even apply to the USEF program to become licensed. These prerequisites are outlined in the US Equestrian Licensed Officials Policies and Procedures document and are as follows.

Be a member in good standing with the USDF

Document that I had experience at 3 different USEF/USDF recognized dressage competitions as a competitor, trainer, coach, groom, or owner. My documentation was as a competitor.

Document that I served in a position of responsibility at a minimum of 6 USEF/USDF recognized dressage competitions. Positions for me included Show Manager, Show Assistant Manager, Scribe, Scorer, Ring Steward, Volunteer Coordinator and Equipment Checker.

Attend a USDF Apprentice TD Clinic and Pass a USDF Competition Management Course.

Once all of the prerequisites were completed, I was able to officially apply to enter the TD program. I had to complete the following requirements within the next 2 years.

Attend and pass a USEF Measurement Certification clinic (to be able to officially measure ponies at shows) Attend a USEF/USDF Dressage TD clinic.

Apprentice at a minimum of 4 different USEF/USDF recognized Dressage Competitions (there were additional requirements regarding the level of TD I did my apprenticeships with, the level of the competitions, the number of days the competitions ran, and the location of the shows and if they were in or out of my home Region). Pass a final written examination.

Now that I'm licensed as an "r" TD, I have to also meeting maintenance requirements to keep my license in good standing.

Remain a member in good standing with the USDF.

Officiate at 3 USEF/USDF recognized competitions every 3 years.

Attend a USEF/USDF Dressage TD clinic every three years.

Complete the USEF Measurement Certification maintenance requirements every three years (to continue to be able to measure ponies).

Pass a TD test every three years.

Pass an annual online "New Rules and Equipment" quiz.

Pass 3 Continuing Education Learning Modules annually.

When Not to be an Expert

If you are pursuing Western Dressage, you may, like me, be tempted to take a Western riding vacation to experience cows, cowboys, desert plains, red rock canyons and all the stuff you dreamed about as a ten year old. If you're from around here, it's usually somewhere too far to take your own horse so you will be assigned one by the Lead Wrangler. He or she will give you a release form to sign and also a form to indicate your level of riding experience: beginner, intermediate, or expert.

DO NOT – I REPEAT, DO NOT – check the expert/ experienced/advanced' box or whatever word they use to indicate that you're anything but a beginner; or at most, an intermediate. I don't care how many medals or ribbons you have; it will not end well. The Wrangler will smile politely and immediately assign you the rankest, nastiest juggernaut on the ranch.

Thirty years ago when I started switching from English to Western I signed up for a week-long stay at an upscale 'dude ranch' in Wickenburg, Arizona. When I signed the horsemanship form I circled 'expert.' I don't remember if it was hubris or the confidence you get from starting horses all your life. I do remember him double checking to make sure I wanted to check that box. I wasn't paying attention.

I should have known something was up when, on the second day, I was asked if I wanted to go on a 'special' ride with a few other guests. It was special all right: an all-out, whoop it up gallop through canyons and arroyos, just the way I imagined, except for the lack of control part. Since I have cross-country in my background I was just playing follow the leader and keeping up pretty well, until the leaders made a sudden sharp turn to the right to go up a hill. My horse turned with them, unexpected and way too early, and in so doing swept my right leg through a huge cactus.

The pain was instant and intense. I don't remember hauling that horse to a stop or getting off but I do remember what I saw when I surveyed the damage. Thorns were sticking out of my leg from knee to ankle, some of them 3" long from point of entry. The speed of the horse and the size of the cactus had driven those spines through my leather cowboy boots and jeans straight into my flesh, leaving them stuck there. There were so many, large and small, that I was still pulling them out of my knee and shin two weeks later. When the Wrangler came back to find


me, all I could say was, "Got pliers?" After all, an 'expert' would have had better control of her horse.

If you think that may have been a one-timer, twenty years later, I'm back in Wickenburg on business and decide to go on a group ride in the desert. When the Wrangler asked what level of rider I was, I told him 'Rank beginner, and please put me on Old Grandma.' He laughed and laughed, then said, "I guess you learned something somewhere."

I surely did. And in case you think it's just cowboys, when I told that story to the late Margaret Halas she said she had the same experience on a riding vacation in Great Britain. She also circled 'advanced.' At that point her vacation, which was supposed to feature scenic rides across country, became a cross-country point-to-point with her mounted on a dead-mouthed ex-Steeplechaser with a score to settle.

Don't poke the Wrangler. Stay humble, admit only to Level One and let him or her judge. Otherwise, like any responsible horse person, he or she might be inclined to test your skills from the get-go, just to see what they're dealing with, and these tests bear no resemblance whatsoever to what happens in an arena. Also, you're on vacation. You will want pictures and it's very hard to whip out your phone when you're hanging on for dear life. Enough said.

First Evidence for Horseback Riding Dates Back 5,000 Years

WASHINGTON (AP) — Archaeologists have found the earliest direct evidence for horseback riding — an innovation that would transform history — in 5,000 year old human skeletons in central Europe.

"When you get on a horse and ride it fast, it's a thrill — I'm sure ancient humans felt the same way," said David Anthony, a co-author of the study and Hartwick College archaeologist. "Horseback riding was the fastest a human could go before the railroads."

Researchers analyzed more than 200 Bronze Age skeletal remains in museum collections in Bulgaria, Poland, Romania, Hungary and the Czech Republic to look for signs of what co-author and University of Helsinki anthropologist Martin Trautmann calls "horse rider syndrome" — six telltale markers that indicate a person was likely riding an animal, including characteristic wear marks on the hip sockets, thigh bone and pelvis.

"You can read bones like biographies," said Trautmann, who has previously studied similar wear patterns in skeletons from later periods when horseback riding is wellestablished in the historical record..

The researchers focused on human skeletons — which are more readily preserved than horse bones in burial sites and museums — and identified five likely riders who lived around 4,500 to 5,000 years ago and belonged to a Bronze Age people called the Yamnaya.

"There is earlier evidence for harnessing and milking of horses, but this is the earliest direct evidence so far for horseback riding," said University of Exeter archaeologist

Alan Outram, who was not involved in the research, but praised the approach.

The study was published Friday in the journal Science Advances.

Domesticating wild horses on the plains of Eurasia was a process, not a single event, the researchers say.

Archaeologists have previously found evidence of people consuming horse milk in dental remains and indications of horses controlled by harnesses and bits dating back more than 5,000 years, but that does not necessarily indicate the horses were ridden. The Yamnaya culture,

known for its characteristic burial mounds, originated in what's now part of Ukraine and western Russia, an area called the Pontic Caspian steppe. The horses they kept were distinct from modern horses — likely more easily startled and less tolerant of humans — although they may have been the immediate genetic ancestors of modern



horses, which emerged a few centuries later, the researchers say.






Member Spotlight




