

What Makes a Good Dressage Show Article by Karen Puchalsky, NODA Volunteer Coordinator and TDF Liaison Photos by Mosie Welch, Newsletter Editor

For all the people that compete in either a schooling show or a recognized show, we know all the tireless time and effort that goes into training to prepare for the show. That doesn't even consider the time it takes to pack up your tack, show clothes, your horse and drive to the show. So, now that you are finally ready to take that ride down center line, you find the show where you want to compete. What if there were no shows? Most people do not realize all the time, effort and people needed to prepare for and run a Dressage show.

Recently I was the volunteer coordinator for NODA's recognized show held this year in May at Chagrin Valley Farms. I got a first-hand look at everything it took to plan, prepare, and run a recognized show. The show was held in early May, but the preparation for the show started years before and required a team of people to make it a success.

Every show manager has his/hers own checklist, but if you want to get an idea of what a checklist looks like go to USDF Competition Forms and look at the guidelines for



before the show. Most managers start by securing the judges, Technical Delegate, and the show secretary for the show. This is usually done one to two years before the show because judges are booked years in advance. Next is to confirm the facility where the show will be held. Then comes developing the Prize List and getting it approved by USDF.

As the show gets closer, more and more tasks need to be completed. To name a few, there is collecting donation "gifts" to put in the volunteer bags and to give out to the competitors, buy the treats for the judges' boxes and the volunteers, order the T-shirts for the volunteers, order the ribbons, reach out to the breed associations to order breed ribbons, set up the rings, and start to get people to sign up to volunteer for all the positions needed to run a show successfully.

As the entries start to come in, the show secretary must make sure the entry forms are completed correctly, the correct amount of money is included, and all the correct horse, owner, and rider numbers are included. After the

closing date, the secretary starts to schedule the show. There are USDF guidelines that must be followed when scheduling a show. For example, if a horse/rider combination is riding two tests in the same day, there must be the correct amount of time scheduled between the rides. Now, the most important part --- Volunteers! I was very fortunate to have many, many NODA members step up and volunteer at the show. Each morning I was stressed until everyone checked in. Lucky for me, everyone showed up and I even had people come to help that didn't sign up in advance.



So, the next time you plan to take that ride down centerline, remember all the work that happened before the first rider enters the ring. Even if you can only volunteer for a couple of hours at the show, it would be greatly appreciated. I met so many wonderful people who volunteered and am so thankful for every one of them.
