USDF Partnering with Black Horse One to Develop New 2024 Judge Education Initiative For Immediate Release Monday, December 11, 2023

The United States Dressage Federation[™] (USDF) is excited to announce the development of a new judge education initiative, in partnership with Black Horse One (BHO) and with funding support provided by The Dressage Foundation's Mary Anne and Walter McPhail Judge Education Fund, to be launched in 2024. This new initiative will provide enhanced education opportunities for USEF judges and USDF L Education Program candidates, through the well established virtual and interactive technology capabilities of BHO. While these programs will consist of three types of educational sessions (online, virtual interactive, and live interactive), the intent is not to replace, but to complement and supplement the live L Program and USEF judge training sessions already conducted by USDF.

In addition to supplementing the existing education and training offerings, these programs will allow USDF to offer more indepth education sessions and modules for designated and nondesignated specialties, such as Freestyle, Young Horse, Para, and Dressage Seat Equitation, to utilize these sessions for compulsory education while also broadening the offerings of noncompulsory education, and to provide even more online and virtual education from a judging perspective to the entire USDF membership and dressage community.

When speaking on the exciting new initiative, USDF President George Williams had this to say, "Black Horse One, whose platform is currently being utilized as an enhancement to the FEI's judge education and development, is already well established as the premier source for online, virtual, and interactive education for judges, specifically through their BHO Masters Symposiums. So, partnering with them to further enhance and develop our existing USEF and USDF training opportunities was a no-brainer. The combination of their tech savvy and proven success in this virtual arena makes them the perfect partner to move our judge education into the future. Why Working Equitation for Dressage Riders? By Mosie Welch

The Discipline of Working Equitation (WE) is an international sport based on dressage for all horses. It promotes trust between a horse and rider combination, develops rideability over time, and is just good fun. Horse and rider pairs may compete or participate in clinics and fun days. No matter how you participate, WE will make you a better rider and your horse more ridable. There are

four phases in Working Equitation which include the Dressage Test, Ease of Handling or obstacle phase, the Speed Trial which is an obstacle course which you may ride as fast as you choose, and the Cattle Trial for those who choose to participate. Unlike classical dressage, working equitation tests require riders to back their horse and canter at the novice levels and backing is required in all of the four phases. NODA is offering a WE Clinic on March 9 with WE Master Level **Rider and USDF Gold Medalist,** Emily Gill which will focus on the Ease of Handling phase. But no worries, there will be no cattle involved!

Ease of Handling focuses on specific obstacles as well as how the pair moves from obstacle to obstacle. The objectives for the Ease of Handing Trial, "... is to show both the rider's and horse's capacity for calmness, precision, style, and regularity in performing the obstacles, providing evidence of harmony between the horse and rider. This trial is not timed. " (USA Working Rules Equitation Rules Section 6.1)

Ease of Handling stresses dressage basics such as relaxation, impulsion, straightness, contact and connection, quality of the gait in all movements, the horse's rhythm, transitions within and between the gaits, bend, the effectiveness of the riders aids at all gaits, geometry of movements, immobility at the halt, and working, lengthened, and collected gaits. Sound familiar?

Are you wondering what a WE Ease of Handling Clinic with Emily Gill will be like? Encouraging! While you and your horse work at the level you are comfortable with and capable of, Emily make it fun, positive, and enlightening!

Rider and horse pairs of all levels are welcome! You will be riding in groups of four. If your horse has not experienced obstacles before or there is some aspect of the course that is a challenge for you or your horse, hand walking and introducing your horse in a positive manner before mounting is encouraged. After a warm up period each obstacle is explained along with the steps to achieving

> the obstacle. Then it's time for you to give it a try. If your horse balks or hesitates at any step of an obstacle, Emily has patience, solutions, and may even recommend a building block approach taking it one step at a time. Every horse and rider pair may not complete every obstacle in the first clinic, however you will leave with tools to work on the obstacles you and your horse find challenging

For more experienced WE riders or those whose horse takes to obstacles like a duck in water, you'll have plenty of time to prac-

tice while Emily is working with other riders. When it's your turn to go through the obstacle Emily will focus on your dressage basics and point out what you can do to improve your execution. You'll get competition tips too!

Your group ride ends with each horse and rider pair that chooses to participate putting it all together by going through a WE course. WE is a mental break for your horse while you work on everything you need to complete an accurate and well executed classical dressage test.

Horse People - A Unique Breed Getting Grants to Support Your Habit!

We are truly a special breed! I've been called a horse person by many people including family, non-horse friends, and even my Chiropractor! How many times have we needed a new pair of paddock boots, but our horses needed new shoes, or a vet treatment and we made our paddock boots last a little longer so our horse could get what they needed? Many times, we joke that if we knew that buying a horse was the least expensive part of owning a horse, would we rethink our decision? I don't know about you, but my answer is NEVER!! But, don't you wish you had a Fairy God Mother who would magically give you money to advance your Dressage education? Well, there is—The Dressage Foundation!

It wasn't until I became The Dressage Foundation Liaison for NODA, that I learned what was available in grants to help. Whether you are a Youth/Young Adult, Adult Amateur, Trainer, or involved in show management, there are grants available to you. Many of these grants are created in memory of people that spent years in the dressage world and wanted to help others continue their journey in the sport of Dressage. The Carol Lavell's Fund named in remembrance of her great dressage horse "Gifted" is to "give permission" to adult amateur riders to set aside quality time to concentrated on training. Up to nine \$1,500 grants are available each year (one in each USDF Region), plus two additional \$1,500 wild card grants. Wouldn't an extra \$1,500 help toward your training?

- Adult Amateurs
- Breed Specific Funds
- Dressage Judges
- Dressage Instructors
- Educational Events

- Para-Equestrian Dressage

- Western Dressage

Research and find a grant That works for you!

Also, don't forget about The Dressage Foundation's Century Club. Riding doesn't have to stop when you reach a certain age, and The Dressage Foundation celebrates the riders that continue to ride despite their age. The Century Club recognizes dressage riders and horses whose combined ages total 100 years or more. Horse and rider perform a test of any level at a show (schooling or recognized) or event and are scored by a dressage judge or professional. Western Dressage riders are also welcome to join the Century Club. An application (found under the "Join the Century Club" heading) should be completed and sent to the Foundation at least two weeks prior to the ride. The Dressage Foundation (TDF) will send a beautiful black and gold ribbon to be presented to the team at the show. Following the ride, TDF sends a Century Club plaque to the new team.

Grants are awarded throughout the year and have different application deadlines. So don't wait until it is too late. Start planning today by going to The Dressage Foundation's website at <u>https://www.dressagefoundation.org/grants-and-programs/apply/</u> to learn more about the grants and how to apply.

Schooling Show Rider Medal Program

The NODA Schooling Show Rider Medal Program allows competitors to set long term goals to achieve long-term rider goals. Rider scores do NOT expire beginning with the 2020 competition season forward. Scores earned prior to the start of the 2020 shows will not be considered.

Riders earn scores at any test of the level and may earn their medals in any order. Rider s may earn scores on any horse, but if they choose to return to lower levels with your current horse, to show for a medal score 2 or more levels below where you currently show, you must show Hors Concours (HC). For example, a 1st level rider returning to Intro for a medal score will need to ride HC. You do not have to earn your medal in one year. Medals are awarded at our annual banquet in November. To receive your medal(s) at the banquet, please submit your application by November 1st.

Rider Medal Levels and Score Requirements Bronze Medal Requirements

Classical Dressage riders must earn at least 65% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Intro level and earn at least 65% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Training Level. Western Dressage riders must earn at least 65% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Intro level and earn at least 65% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Basic Level.

Silver Medal Requirements

Classical Dressage riders must earn at least 62% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at 1st level and earn at least 62% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at 2nd level.

Western Dressage riders must earn at least 62% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Level One and earn at least 62% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Level 2.

Gold Medal Requirements

Classical Dressage riders must earn at least 60% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at 3rd level and at least 60% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at 4th level.

Western Dressage riders must earn at least 60% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Level Three and at least 60% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows at Level 4.

FEI Medal Requirements

Classical Dressage riders must earn at least 60% at 4 separate NODA schooling shows. Scores must be earned in two or more FEI levels (Prix St. Georges through Grand Prix).

Grants are awarded throughout the year and have application deadlines. Don't wait until it is too late, go to The Dressage Foundation's website at <u>www.dressagefoundation.org/grants-and-programs/apply/</u> to find out more!

<u>The Dressage Foundation (TDF)</u> is pleased to announce new grant application deadlines for <u>TDF's GroupEducation</u> <u>Grant Funds.</u> TDF offers a variety of grants to help fund educational events across the country and typically awards over 25 grants per year. The deadline to apply has been reduced to 75 days prior to the event.

"TDF hopes to encourage more groups and organizations to apply for TDF's many grants. The Group Education Fund grants are a wonderful way to help educate dressage riders and trainers across the country more affordably. We hope these new deadlines will make it easier for organizers to apply," said Sara Weiss, TDF's Director of Grants and Programs.

Thanks to the many generous donors throughout the years, TDF has been able to support a variety of educational opportunities for riders, instructors, and judges of different levels and in areas throughout the country. Grants are available year-round for USDF Group Member Organizations (GMOs), non-profits, and other equestrian organizations to host events in 2024 and beyond. Applications for these grants are due to TDF at least 75 days prior to the event.

Dancing Horse Fund: For non-profit groups to hold musical freestyle clinics and seminars or to purchase sound systems to use for freestyle events.

Dreitzler International Clinician Fund: Provides financial support for equestrian organizations, dressage clubs, and owners of private facilities who are hosting educational events with clinicians from countries outside of the United States.

Edgar Hotz Judges Education Fund: Provides support to USDF GMOs for the "Continuing Education for Judges and L Program Graduates" program. (Apply through USDF at least 60 days prior to the event.)

Lynn Palm Western Dressage Fund: The goal of this Fund is to provide grants for equestrian groups to host affordable, high-quality Western Dressage educational events.

Max E. Gahwyler Instructor Education Fund: Grants are available for equestrian organizations, dressage clubs, or owners of private facilities who are hosting educational events for dressage instructors, including the USDF Instructor/ Trainer Development Program.

Michael Poulin Dressage Fund: For non-profit groups or individuals to host an event that will improve the quality of dressage in their area through riding, training, instructing, and/or judging. Applications should be bold, creative, and collaborative.

Oregon Dressage Society Linda S. Acheson Fund: Provides grants to ODS, ODS Chapters, and ODS Committees that are organizing educational events that will benefit the Oregon dressage community and help further the mission of the Oregon Dressage Society.

Sally Swift Fund for Centered Riding Clinics: For non-profit groups to organize a Centered Riding[©] clinic.

Violet Hopkins Fund for GMO Events: For USDF GMOs to host a variety of educational events, such as camps, symposia, and seminars for riders of all ages and levels.

How to Design a Dressage *Musical Freestyle *

in 6 Easy Steps



Review the Requirements

The USDF and WDAA both have score sheets and for the level you are trying to compete. If competing in a recognized competition, there are

Learn your Horse's Tempo

Videotape yourself riding your horse at the walk, trot, and canter in a full-size arena for at least two minutes in each direction, right and left. Then, use this video to determine your horse's beats per minute (BPM) for each gait.

Find your Music

Listen to lots of music to identify which songs are close to your horse's tempos at the three gaits. Keep a list of your favorites and them test them to make sure your horse shakes its groove thing to the beat

---Chart out your Choreography

riding. Remember it's YOUR test to highlight your horse's strengths and just meet the requirements for any weakness.





Practice Putting it Together

Video your pattern with the music playing in the background. Get the timing of each movement so that you can splice the walk, trot, and canter music with the amount of time you will need to get from movement to movement. Think about artistic expression and which pieces of music highlight you.

RIDE, RIDE, RIDE

Once your music is put together to match your choreography - RIDE! Practice the timing, and how things hit, and try riding in as many rings as you can. No two freestyles will ride the same in a ring, but remember only you know your test! Most importantly HAVE FUN!



Applying for Amateur \$250 Scholarship Open to Adults and Youth

The education of our Amateur members (Junior, Young Rider and Adult) is very important to NODA as riders, horse owners, and possible future trainers. Each year NODA offers four (4) scholarships in the amount of \$250 each. Two (2) are designated for Junior/Young Riders, and two (2) are designated for Adult Amateurs. An amateur member may be awarded a scholarship once every three years. If you apply and are not awarded a scholarship, please re-apply the following year.

Scholarship Use: Scholarships may be used for any educational dressage event. This includes all dressage clinics, seminars, symposiums, lessons, and other dressage education events. Scholarship funds may not be applied to show fees, board bills, or leasing costs. At the time of application, applicants are not required to have detailed and specific plans for the money.

Application Deadline October 1 of the Year PRIOR to the Scholarship Award. For example, if you wish to receive money for an event taking place in the year 2024, you must submit your Application Packet to NODA by October 1, 2023

Application Review: A scholarship committee will review and evaluate all applications received by the October 1st deadline according to the Scholarship Evaluation Rubric. Application Receipt & Award Notification NODA will acknowledge receipt of applications. Scholarship Recipients announced at the annual November Year-End Awards Banquet. All applicants will be notified by November 30th of the current year whether or not they will be awarded NODA scholarship.

Scholarship Funds Request: When a scholarship recipient determines an education event for which to use his/ her scholarship funds, he/she is required to submit a Check Request Form in order to receive scholarship money. Funds will be reimbursed in the form of a check made payable directly to the clinician or host of the event. Scholarship recipients may use their scholarships toward more than one educational dressage event.

RECOGNIZED SHOWS USEF & USDF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS SIMPLIFIED

Recognized shows can be an expensive proposition so I am going to offer 3 approaches to meeting USEF and USDF Membership Requirements: an inexpensive way, a reasonable way, and a "let's go for it all" way. We'll start in the middle, the way most riders take. This article hopefully will answer many of your own questions.

1. For riders who plan to attend two or more Recognized Shows, but are not interested in qualifying for the Regional Championships, here's what you need to do. a. Join USEF. Annual membership fees for the USEF have dropped in the last few years to \$55 while USEF nonmember fees per show have risen to \$30. Simple math will tell you that two non-member fees will cost more than the membership itself. An added bonus for amateur riders is that the USEF Amateur Card comes free with the membership—and you must have an Amateur Card to enter any class designated as "adult amateur." NOTE: As of 2014, only active USEF members may obtain Amateur status.

b. Join NODA (or any of the other Group Member Organizations of the USDF). Part of your NODA membership fees pay for a USDF Group Membership (a USDF requirement). This group membership allows you to participate in USEF/ USDF recognized shows without paying a USDF nonmembership fee (\$25 per show). Group members can still submit their scores for the USDF Rider Award programs such as Rider Performance awards or the Bronze Medal. c. Get a USDF HID. A USDF HID (Horse Identification Number) is needed to enter all recognized dressage shows. If your horse already has a USDF HID or lifetime number registered in your name, you do not have to do anything more. If your horse has never been registered with the USDF, you can file the HID application online. It is a one-time fee of \$25 and the number will stay with the horse for its lifetime, If, however, your horse has already been registered by a previous owner, you will have to transfer the ownership to your own name after providing some proof of the new ownership. (Go to the USDF website and search for the "Transfer of Ownership" form. It might take over a month to get the HID certificate back, so plan on doing this early.)

d. Get a USEF HID. Although you do not need a USEF HID number for your horse at a dressage show, I would still suggest getting one. When you enter a recognized show, you need to provide proof of all your memberships. The simplest way is printing out a USEF/USDF master verification sheet—and it is much easier if your horse has both USEF and USDF numbers. If your horse has not been registered already with the USEF, you can apply for a USEF HID online for free. If your horse has been registered already by a prior owner, you may not use that number until you have registered a transfer of ownership with the USEF. (More on the master verification sheet at a later date!)

e. Owners and Riders. If you are not the owner of the horse you are showing, then the owner must have the same USEF/USDF memberships listed above (or pay the non-member fees) and the horse must have a USDF HID in the name of the actual owner. One word of advice, only the owner may sign a Transfer of Ownership form. If two or more people own the horse, only one of the owners must be a member to avoid paying the non-member fees. When filling out an entry form, make sure you list the owner who is the member.

2. For those riders who plan to ride in the Regional Championships, things become more complicated and expensive.

a. Join the USEF. Non-members may not attempt to qualify for Regionals.



b. Apply for a participating membership in the USDF. A group membership does not make you eligible to qualify.
c. Get a USDF lifetime registration for the horse. If your horse already has a HID, then you only have to pay for the upgrade. The horse number itself will remain the same—just the status has changed.

d. Get either a USEF Annual or lifetime recording for the horse. The free USEF HID above is not valid for regional championships. **Continued on page 28**

e. Owners and Riders. If you are not the owner of the horse, then the owner must have the same USEF/USDF memberships that you have. The owner must also have the horse listed with both the USEF and USDF.

f. Region Championships If you had not originally planned to qualify for the Regionals and later change your mind, you can always apply for the USDF participating membership on line as well as upgrade your USEF and/or USDF HID numbers. Another way is to contact the show secretary about filling out the necessary forms when you get to the show. Remember though-- if a transfer of ownership must be filed at the show, then the owner must be present to sign the form.

3. Opportunity Classes One relatively inexpensive choice now exists for the riders who do not want to spend lots of money this year but want the chance to participate in the recognized shows. The way to avoid membership and/or HID fees would be to sign up for only Opportunity Classes. These classes must have the word "Opportunity" in the title. When you enter only Opportunity Classes, you are exempt from all non-member and horse registration fees. The downside of the Opportunity classes is that the results will not count for any USEF or USDF award programs. The NODA Board, however, has voted to allow these score to be used for schooling show awards. USEF Level 1, 2, and 3 competitions are permitted to offer a limited number Opportunity Classes from Introductory to Second Level, including Rider Tests (new in 2017). The Level of USEF Competition determines which Levels/Tests may be offered.

This is a simplified version of all the USDF and USEF requirements for competing at Recognized Shows.

If you have a specific question that cannot be answered from the information above, please refer to the USEF Rulebook and/or the USDF website.
